TROOPS AT GUIGUINTO.

Our Soldiers Only Three and a Half Miles From Malolos.

PIERCE FIGHTING ON THE WAY.

Our Casualties For the Day Numbered Seventy, Including One Pennsylvanian Killed-A Hard Fight Probable Before the Rebel Capital Is Captured Manila, March 30.-General Otis sent the following advices to Washington to-

"MacArthur advanced at 6 o'clock yesterday morning from Marilao. Passed rapidly to Bocave. At 11:45 took up the advance for Bigan, and at 3:15 this afternoon for Guigniuto, three and a half miles from Malolos, reaching that point at 5 o'clock. Casualties for the day about 70. Flerce fighting in the after-

noon. Troops made the crossing of the river at Guiguinto by working the ar-tillery over the railroad bridge by hand and switaming males against fierce vesistance. The column will pass on the railroad to extreme front, nearly repaired, and will resupply troops today. General MacArthur's division advance ed from Marilao along the railroad to Bigan, five miles distant, with the Ne

The American forces met strong op-position in the jungle. First one Ne-braskan, then one Pennsylvanian, and afterwards two of the Montana regiments were killed. Thirty-five were wounded, including one officer of the Kansas regiment.
The rebels burned the villages as they

retreated in bad order towards Malolos. The enemy also tore up sections of the railroad in many places and attempted to burn the bridge at Bigga, but the fire was extinguished, owing to the timely arrival of the Americans. The rebels had not finished their trenches along the line of yesterday's march, showing they were not prepared for our advance. It is believed, however, that there will be a hard fight before Malolos is taken.

The Minnesota regiment reinforced the division yesterday, marching from the water works during the night to Manila and going to the frost by train.

Consul Williams says he never saw Agoncillo, nor made such a promisto any Filipino.

London and Berlin did not take such a gloomy view of the outlook. While re-ognising that the bloodshed at Samon nation, get it was said to be a situation which had been clearly apprehended and had been discussed in mivage between the representatives of three governments The real crisis, from an international standpoint, occurred last week, when this apprehended outbreak was discus-Although relations were greatly strained, it was possible to seesite an understanding which is said to make sure that the outbreak now reported will not cause a rupture in the relations between the United States and Germany. or between Great Britain and German;

That some evert act would take place has been apprehended for many days, but there was little idea it would take a broad sweep and lead to such heavy loss of life. In this aspect of the case the actual results were regarded as far more serious than those which had been expected and provided for during the recent diplomatic exchanges between the three governments. Moreover, new elements of international danger had un expectedly arisen. These included the proclamation of the German consul, Rose, which it is believed tended to incite the Matsufa party to an open re volt; also the wounding and killing of British sailors and marines, the shooting of an American sentry and the at-tacks on the several consulates. These all invoke unknown possibilities of seri-

The diplomatic exchanges leading up to this crisis have been very sharp with in the last few days. Early last week the Berlin government received directinformation from Samoa Get Admir-Kautz had arrived there and had sum moned a meeting of all the officials for March 11. The German authorities felt sure this meeting would result in seri-ous trouble. The Berlin foreign office, therefore, instructed the German ambasandor here, Dr. Von Holleben, to pre-sent a note embodying Germany's views. It argued that a naval commander had no right to act save in executing the will of the three consuls, acting unanimously, and not through a majority. But aside from this argument the German not-intimated quite plainly that Germany would hold the other governments re-sponsible if serious trouble resulted from the action of the naval authorities in Samoa. The strained conditions caused by this note were somewhat allayed by the answer of the state department. which was friendly and reassuring, although it made plain that the American naval commander would act in an emer gency, even though the consuls were not occurred in Samoa.

There is no apprehension here that an actual clash will occur with the German civil or naval forces in Samoa. This is due mainly to the official understanding that Germany has given positive orders to the commander of the German warship Falke to refrain from any ac tive move.

Major Black's Sensational Testimony Refere the Boof Investigatory. Miles' charges concerning the beef supplied to the army during the Spanish war had former Commissary General Eagan before it resterday on recall, an also heard the testimony of Rear Admiral Stewart and Paymaster Colby, of the navy, and Major Black and Captain Pomeroy, volunteer officers, who were engaged in the commission services at Ponce during General Miles' Porto Blean

General Engan's testimony was no startling. He stated that Mesers Ar moor & Co. had put in a bid to aspect moor & Co. had put in a bid to supply beef to be preserved by a process of their own, but that he had not considered it.
