

## CAUGHT IN AN AMBUSH.

Americans and Britons Surprised by Mataafa's Savages.

FOUR AMERICANS KILLED.

Three Britons Were Also Left Dead on the Field.

THE DEAD BODIES DECAPITATED.

The Expedition, Under Command of British Lieutenant Freeman, Numbered a Hundred Bluejackets, and They Were Pounced Upon by Eight Hundred Mataafans-Lieutenant Lausdale and Ensign Monaghan, of the Philadelphia, Among the Dead-At Washington, London and Berlin There Is No Fear of Se- 5 rious International Complications.

Auckland, N. Z., April 13,-Dispatches received here from Apia, Samoa, April 1, say that a party of 105 American and British sailors were forced to retreat to the beach after having being caught in an ambush on a German plantation that day. The expedition was led by Lieutenant Freeman, of the British third class cruiser Tauranga. Lieutenant Freeman and Lieutenant Greene's Warranted Syrup of Tar if it falls P. L. Lansdale, of the United States cruiser Philadelphia, and Ensign J. R. money refunded. A. Wasley, C. H. Hagen- Philadelphia, were left dead on the field. Ensign Monaghan remained to assist Lieutenant Lansdale, and was shot in retiring. Two British and two American sailors were also killed.

The natives engaged were some of Mataafa's warriors. They severed the heads of the British and American officers killed. Priests of the French mission afterwards brought the heads into Apia.

The manager of the German plantation has been arrested and detained on board the Tauranga, on affidavits declaring that he was seen urging the rebels to fight.

In a previous engagement 27 of Mataafa's warriors were killed and there were no casualties among the European

Eight hundred of Matanfa's men were in the ambush, and the American and British force amounted to 105. The fighting was terrific, the American and British tars repeatedly beating back their assailants, who sought to overwhelm them by force of numbers. After the rebels had been driven off the bodies of the three officers were recovered.

Mataafa's loss was 40 killed and a number wounded, these being carried off the field by the rebels when they retired. The bodies of Lansdale, Monaghan and Freeman, as well as those of the unfortunate marines, were buried with military honors at Mulinus.

There is constant fighting with the natives around Apia, and the life of no European in the islands is safe.

LAWTON CAPTURES REBEL NAVY

Witnesses Before the Philippines Commission Declare That Independence Would Result in Chaos, Endless Tribal Wars and European Intervention

Mantla, April 13.-General Wheaton started at daylight yesterday with the Tenth Pennsylvania and the Second Oregon regiments and two guns to drive the rebels from the American right flank, between the rallroad and the foothills. He met with slight resistance near Santa Maria, and had one man wounded. But the enemy bolted when shelled by the artillery and burned and abandoned the town of Santa Maria, where a thousand rebels were reported to have been concentrated. During the rest of the day the enemy was in full retreat towards the mountains, burning the villages behind the retreating force. Occasionally a few of the rebels dropped to the rear and fired at the advancing Amercan troops from the jungle, apparently with the idea that this would check our advance and cover the retreat of the Filipinos. But, finding these tactics ineffectual, these rebels scrambled after the main body, General Wheaton has telegraphed to Major General Otis, saying: "They would not wait to be killed."

The American guard along the rallroad has been materially strengthened, and it is not likely the rebels will succeed in getting in the future to as close puarters as they did on Tuesday, even If they return to the mountains. General Lawton is scouring the vicinity of Santa Cruz. He finds the rebels have decamped. He has se-
