of the Sea." Atlanta, Ga., April 14,--Mrs. Mc-Alexander, d this city, has received a letter from her brother, Hon. W. H. Chambers, chief justice of Samoa. The letter is dated March 21, and left Apia on the 24th, the day after the installation of the king in whose favor Chief. Justice Chambers decided. Judge Chambers' letter tells of the attack of the ships on the native villages, and says this work will be kept up until all the towns of the leading chiefs have t been visited unless the rebels sur-render. The letter is in part as fol-

"A man with courage, with no one to be anxious about, can easily take care of himself here. Of course I do not live at our house, which is a mile from the beach, but have taken a nica little cottage right on the water, with all four warships alongside only a few hundred yards away.

"March 23-I accepted an invita-tion from my friend, Captain Sturdee, of the Porpoise, and spent night be-fore last on board, and yesterday we put to sea and went down the coast some 20 miles and attacked the rebels. We took with us a large number of loval natives, who landed under cover of the ship's guns and did consider able damage. Among other things they burned the houses of three high chiefs and captured 11 big boats, one of them capable of carrying over a

hundred warriors. "It was decided last night at an conference of all (except Germany) put 'my king' on the throne at 4 o'clock today, and you must imagine better than I can tell you how happy I am, for this is not only the realization of my fondest wish, but a complete vin-dication of my legal position. Admiral Kautz is a splendid old man of the sea. He has stood by me from the day of his arrival, as you will see from his proclamation which he issued only a few days later. Captain Sturdee, of the Porpoise, Captain Torbosee, of the Royalist, and Con-suls Osborn and Maxe were already my staunch friends.

"March 24-The mail signal is up and the Mariposa will be in the harbo in about an hour, so I can only add a line. The young king was installed yesterday evening at 4. Thousands of loyal natives happy, but no man happier than I. The man I decided was rightful king has been put on the throne by the power of my own coun-try and dear old England."



ties Concerned to Settle Their Own Differences-Increase of Population. Washington, April 14 .-- W. C. Pearce. miner of 25 years experience, ecretary and treasurer of the United Mine Workers' association, was the only witness before the industrial commission yesterday. Ten years experi-ence as an official of the association, he suid, enabled him to declare that the organization never attempted to force men to strike. They influenced miners only through missionary work, Mr. Pearce criticized the use o creens in mining as causing consider able friction between men and oper ators. His organization favored con ciliation and arbitration wherever pos sible, and denounced the injunction as a breeder of violence nd strike. Com-pany stores and company shoes, he said, tended to prevent strikes, because they helped to make the miners dependent upon the company. The ten-dency of wages was down, and this decline was checked only partially by the efforts of labor organizations. He thought there should be strenuor laws against the employment of child labor in mines. The eight hour labor law was a great boon to the miners. The industrial commission recenti requested ex-Mayor Abram S. Hewitt of New York, to appear before it and plied: give his views on industrial questions.
