

# CHICAOO'S ELEVATED RAILWAYS,

If Constructed, May Become City

Property After Ten Years, Chicago, April 26.-According to the ststement of Attorney John M. Duffy who drew up and has presented to the ity council an ordinance granting to the Chicago Western Elevated Ballway company a franchise to cor a new elevated system for the three divisions of Chicago, the new system will soon be working in this city. 16 is claimed for the system that it has mony advantages over the ways now in use. It occupies but 15 feet of space, and can be run successfully through an alley, the road being supported on but a single line of iron posts. Henry D. Cook, the inventor, chains that a speed can be attained many times greater than by the ordimary methods. The ordinance pro-vides for a 20 year franchise, four cent fare, 10 per cent compensation to the city and after ten years the option of municipal ownership.

Sumilinox Victim Runs Annek. Kansas City; Kan., April 26 .- A negro, broken out with smallpox sores and delirious from the disease, ran through the streets of Kansas City ast evening. His capture by the police revealed the fact that the dise s epidemic among the negroes of this city. So far nearly 30 cases of smallpox have been found, 20 of the cases eing found in one thickly settled block. It appears that the health authorities first made a wrong diagnosis of the disease and later, when they discovered its nature, attempted to conceal the facts. A strict quarantine has been established.
