

The Rebels Wore Pressed Back Whenever They Attempted to Make a Stand, and Finally Fled to the Hills, Leaving Reaps of Dead in Trenches. Manila, April 27.-Calumpit, the Filipino capital, is in the possession of the American troops. The flower of Aguinaldo's army has been annihilated and General MacArthur holds the strategic key to the entire northern part of Luzon.

Eight Americans were killed in the assault upon the city. The loss to the rebels was terrific. What remained of their army was finally driven back into the town and beyond it to the hills. General MacArthur had 6,000 troops engaged in the attack. Their valor was unparalelled.

Calumpit was on fire when the concerted advance of General MacArthur's division, comprising the brigades of Generals Hale, Wheaton and Lawton was ordered.

The insurgents met the advance with severe firing. The greater part of Aguinaldo's army was in the town and the trenches before it, having made a stand there after the fall of Malolos The strategic attack upon the city was made by Hale's brigade, which moved down the right bank of the Quingua river, and by Wheaton's bri-gade, on the left bank.

General Wheaton's command, the Kansas and Montana volunteers, repaired the bridge over the Bagbag river in the morning. The volunteers then crossed and rushed upon the Filipinos in the trenches. The order to advance upon Calum-

pit was received enthusiastically by the American troops. There had long been a thirst among the troops to avenge the death of several of their fellows during the fighting march from Malolos, and they were eager for the capture of the main stronghold of Aguinaldo and his men.

Scouting parties sent out a short time before the attack returned to report that Calumpit had been set afire by the rebels.

In the attack the American troops were deployed in a long line before the city. This line was gradually the city. closed in, maintaining an intense firing upon the trenches and immediate defenses of the capital.

It was short range fighting, and the Americans were more than equal to it, while the insurgents were pressed back whenever they attempted a stand. The guns of the Utah artillery did masterful work. They tore great gaps in the trenches and drove the rebels out with appalling slaughter. Then the infantry men charged the trenches. The rebels stood their ground as long as they could and then fied.

The Americans then had little diffi-culty in entering the city. The fire set by the rebels was spreading rapidly and it seemed a foriorn hope to attempt extinguishing it. On all sides was to be seen the havoc

wrought by the intensity of the Ameri-can firing. The dead rebels lay two, and even three, deep in some places. The trenches were choked with dead

What remained of the rebel army fled to the hills, closely pursued by the American soldiers, although the latter were in a worn out condition from the continuous fighting of the last few days.


