a Excursionists Meet Death While Speeding Round a Curve.

TWO KILLED AND MANY INJURED

Every Seat Was Occupied and Many Were Standing on the Platforms When the Accident Occurred-One Man Crushed to Death Between Cars.

Rochester, N. Y., May 1.—Three persons were killed, more than a dozen seriously injured and 50 less seriously hurt as the result of a wreck yester day afternoon on the Rochester and local citizens can be depended on, for 'tis an Lake Ontario railroad, better known Corners, about one-half mile north of the city line, when two cars on an excursion train filled with passengers left the track while rounding a curve wrecked

The train was crowded with excurstonists bound for different points along the shores of Lake Ontario, in the Irondequoit bay district. Every seat in the coaches was filled and a large number of people were standing avenue and Ridge road, and when this grade was reached the speed of the

train increased perceptibly.

Down the grade swept the train, its speed increasing constantly. It had gone but a part of the hend in the track, when it left the rails and shot straight ahead. There was a sudden crash as the couplings between the engine and coach were severed. Then the coach again veered over and plow ed through the earth for several feet efore dropping on its side.

When the first coach left the track the engine sped on down the track and the other coaches were forced off the track. The closed coach, which was overturned, had in a partition that divided the front part from the rear. The front apartment was a smoking compartment. In it were several men and standing in the entrance were two women and a little girl. These were thrown into a jumbled mass over against the roof of the car and were pinioned under the seats and the par tition of the car, which was torn to

John Hilberg was standing on the third cars and crushed to death. His body was removed with great difficulty and sent to the morgue.



# UP GO THE WAGES

Cheering Notices to Workmen in and About Pittsburg.

POURTEEN THOUSAND BENEFITED

Among Those Who Have Been Given Voluntary Increases Are the Street Rallway Workers-Highest Rate Ever Paid in the Connelisville Region.

Pittsburg, May 1.—Evidences of good times in and around Pittsburg are shown by the following notices of wage increases: The Consolidated Traction company of this city yester-day posted notices granting their more than 1,000 employes an advance in wages of 11 per cent. This advance will give the conductors and motormen 20 cents an hour, which is said to be the highest wages paid by any traction sompany in the country. The company's men who are employed in the power houses, where the work is hard and exhausting, will be granted a reduction of hours without any decrease

A dispatch from Sharon says: No tices of increase in wages of 10 per cent., taking effect today, are posted at all the furnaces in Sharon and Sharps ville. Nearly 1,200 men will be benefited voluntary advance at the furnaces within 30 days.

Connellsville, Pa., sends this item The H. C. Frick Coke company sur-prised and delighted its 12,000 employes by posting notices yesterday at all its plants in the Connellsville coke region, announcing a general ad vance in wages, to take effect today. Every one of the employes of the Frick and McClure plants, also controlled by the Frick company, will receive an advance ranging from 6 to 12½ per cent. The maximum rate of increase will be paid to the employes receiving the lowest wages and the minimum increase will be paid to the employes receiving the highest wages. The new scale will be the highest ever paid in the Connellsville region.

Quarrymen's Wages Advanced, Joliet, Ilis., May 1.—The employes of the Joliet, Rockford and Lemont quarries of the Western Stone company have been notified of an advance in wages of 25 cents a day, to take effect at once. Six hundred men are benefit-ed. Other local quarries will make a similar advance.

### A NEW JERSEY MURDER.

An Italian Beheaded and a Fellow Countryman Under Arrest. Williamstown, N. J., May 1.—The seadless body of Guarro F. Feo, an Italian, of this place, who mysteriously disappeared on April 22, was found yesterday at Blue Anchor, Camden county, a short distance from here. Two hours later his head was picked up in a pine field 300 yards from where dy was found. Fee was undoubtedly murdered, and Francisco Abbatto, another Italian, of this place, is in jail on suspicion of having commited the crime, as he was the last one seen with Feo. On April 22 Feo and Abbetto went driving, but only the latter returned home. Feo is said to have had \$600 with him when he left home. Suspicion was at once placed on Abbatto, and he was arrested last Friday. Feo's wife was also taken into custody as a witness. Searching parties were sent out each day, but no clew could be found until yesterday. The head had been cleanly severed at the shoulders. There were stab wounds on the face and neck.
