New York's Governor Would Thus Punish Wife Beaters and Cruelty.
Albany, May 5.—Governor Roose velt yesterday gave a hearing on the application for a pardon for Henry Hendricks, who is serving a life sentence in Auburn prison for the killing of his wife, whom he shot to death another woman. Hendricks, who is 60 years old, has served 22 years of his sentence. The governor denied the application. He said that to impose a life sentence upon a man of Hendricks caliber was a miscarriage of justice by pardoning the wife murderer. On the trial the jury stood 11 to 1 for conviction for murder in the first degree, but, the odd man remaining firm in his position, a compromise was affected whereby Hendricks received a life sentence.

The old cannon have been dumped and replaced by a few Maxims. The Citadel was looked upon as the Dunkirk of America. It was constructed at an enormous cost. A large number of Maroons were imported from Jamaica to assist in the construction of the works, but the mortality among them was so great that the British government considered it advisable to send them to the River Niger.

Wilmington, N. C., May 5.—Thou-sands of people gathered on the river front and in adjacent streets yesterdey afternoon to witness the expected arrival of the cruiser Raleigh and to ex-tend a greeting to its officers and men, but at about 4:30 o'clock the disap-pointing news was wired from Southport that the ship had not been sight-ed off Cape Fear bar, and that it would be impossible, therefore, for her to reach Wilmington before today. later came the news that, owing to the fact that the Raleigh is drawing 20 feet 6 inches, Captain Coghlan and his officers decided that it was not advisable to take the ship up the river to Wilmington.

At 5:15 o'clock the Oak Island life saving crew signaled that the Raleigh was in sight Steamers in waiting immediately passed out, and with cheers and whistles met the cruiser just off the bar. She was welcomed with the national salute from Fort Caswell and the Hornet, and the Raleigh responded with 21

Florida Sheriff Shot by Assassins. Gainesville, Fla., May 5,-Sheriff H. M. Tillis was probably fatally shot by issassins last evening. He was seated on the plazza of his residence with a young lady, when two men emerged from a lot directly in front of the house and one of them emptled the contents of both barrels of a shotgun at him. The shots took effect in his shoulder and breast. Immediately af ter the shooting the men ran down the street, mounted horses and rode away. Some time ago Sheriff Tillis killed Brack Tillis, his nephew. There is a strong suspicion that the affair of last evening grew out of that episode.

The Austrian Minister's Return. Washington, May 5.—The Austrian minister, Mr. Von Hengelmuller, who has been absent for the last six months, will return the latter part of next month. The claims presented by Austria in connection with the Hazleton riots are now in a fair way toward adjustment, and it is said they will not be the source of any international friction between the two countries. The question of advancing the repre sentatives at Vienna and Washington to the rank of ambassador is still under consideration at the Austrian capital, but no final determination has been reached.
