

ON TO SAN FERNANDO

After the Oapture of San Tomas by Our Victorious Troops.

THE REBELS STUBBORNLY RESIST

But Are Put to Flight With Charming Regularity After Each Stand-Our Casualties Are Very Small-Gallant Brigadler General Funston Wounded

Manila, May 5.-The forces under Major General MacArthur have captured San Tomas, In spite of the peaceful overtures of their commissioners, the Filipinos vigorously resisted the advance of General MacArthur's division from Apalit toward San Fernando, fighting desperately at long range after running from trench to can artillery.

The movement commenced at 5:30 in the morning. General Hale's brigade, consisting of five gatlings, under the command of Major Young, of the Cixth artillery, two battalions of the Fifty-first Iowa regiment, the First Nebraska and the First South Dakota regiment, advanced along the road, a

few miles west of the railway line. General Wheaton, with Hotchkiss and gatling guns, under the command artillery, mounted on hand cars, pushed ahead, the Twentieth Kansas and First Montana regiments deploying to the right and left when feasible

Both brigades met with resistance simultaneously on approaching the river near San Tomas, which is about eight kilometers from Apalit. The center span of the railroad bridge had dropped into the river, and the rebels had only left a small force to check General Wheaton, their main body lining the strong trenches in front of

Although the attacking force poured a very heavy artillery and musketry fire across the river, the enemy stubbornly resisted for over an hour, ultimately breaking when Major Young shelled their left flank, and then retreating along the river bank under

So soon as they discovered that the nature of the country would permit only a few skirmishes on each side of the embankment the rebels regained their courage and fought desperately for three-quarters of an hour, in the face of the American volleys and a rapid fire fusiliade, until flanked by the Montana regiment. Then a general scramble ensued, most of the enemy boarding trains that were in readiness and the others taking the road to San Fernando, after burning the villages of San Tomas and Minalin.

About noon General Wheaton cross-ed the broken bridge, cleared the stragglers out of the villages and advanced towards San Fernando, General Hale effected a crossing simultaneously, after a slight delay neces-sary to repair a stone bridge. Our loss up to noon was two mem-bers of the Nebraska regiment and one

of the Montana killed, and Captain Albrecht, three members of the Kansas regiment, two of the Montana, four of the Nebraska and one of the South Dakota wounded. Brigadier General Funston, of the Twentieth Kansas, was wounded, one lieutenant was killed and four were wounded while leading four companies of the Kansas regiment to outflank the enemy. Our entire loss is very slight.





ADULTERATED FOODS

Prepared in Foreign Countries and Sold Here.

PROHIBITED BY LAW AT HOME,

But the Law Does Not Prevent Germans and French From Sending the Goods Here-Dr. Wiley Declares Food Containing Preservatives # :fit to Eat Chicago, May 5 .- One of the most

important objects sought by the senatorial pure food investigating committee at its second session here yesterday was the formulation of legislation not solely for the protection of the public against adulterated foods manufactured in this country, but also those which are imported. The first witness called was Giles Lewis, a druggist of this city, who stated that while other countries had laws which prevented the selling of adulterated goods in their own countries no pro-visions were made against exporting them to foreign countries. He said the United States received articles of food made in Germany and France that would not be used in the country where they were made, because of the preservatives used. Special mention was made by him of the privileges of German manufacturers who can sell articles of food without hindrance to the United States which cannot be sold

Mr. Lewis advocated the passage of a national pure food law and the appointment of a permanent commis-sion, the duty of which would be to prevent the marketing of any article of food or drink, domestic or imported, that was misrepresented. The limit of adulteration, he declared, should be governed by the commis-sion, and the committee, he suggested, should analyze articles and certify to

their purity by a government stamp. Wiley gave further information to the committee regarding the articles sold in this country which were adulterated. Among practices that are fraudulent, yet not injurious to the health, he mentioned the sale of fish of a cheap variety and grade for more expensive kinds, especially fish packed in oil. It also is a common custom, Dr. Wiley said, for dealers to stamp packages with foreign stamps, and thus deceive the public into believing was buying imported goods. sale of turtles in restaurants for terrapin was also a common means of defrauding the public. Famous wines and other drinks of foreign countries are on sale in American markets that never "even saw the color of the

The witness said that adulterations of food and drink which are injurious to the public health could be classed in two groups—coloring and preserv-ing. The methods of coloring green vegetables were spoken of in detail. The matter which is used mainly in restoring the natural color of green peas, the witness declared, sometimes was salts of sinc and sometimes salts of copper, either of which is poisonous, and the use of which should not be permitted. Probably the most com-mon chemical used as a preservative, according to Dr. Wiley, is salicyclic acid, which is made to a great extent from carbolic acid. It should not be permitted, he stated, because it is very bad for the health, especially to those who have weak stomachs. He ended his testimony regarding the sub-ject by saying that no food which was offered for sale which contained pre-servatives was fit to eat.




