# ON TO SAN FERNANDO

After the Capture of San Tomas by Our Victorious Troops.

# THE REBELS STUBBORNLY RESIST

But Are Put to Flight With Charming Regularity After Each Stand—Our Casualties Are Very Small—Gallant Brigadier General Funston Wounded  
Manila, May 5.—The forces under Major General MacArthur have captured San Tomas. In spite of the peaceful overtures of their commissioners, the Filipinos vigorously resisted the advance of General MacArthur's Division from Apalit toward San Fernando, fighting desperately at long range after running from trench to trench when driven out by the American artillery.  
The movement commenced at 5:30 in the morning. General Hale's brigade, consisting of five battalions, under the command of Major Young, of the Sixth artillery, two battalions of the Fifty-first Iowa regiment, the First Nebraska and the First South Dakota regiments, advanced along the road, a few miles west of the railway line. General Wheaton, with his headquarters and galling guns, under the command of Lieutenant Naylor, of the Utah light artillery, mounted on hand cars, pushed ahead, the Twentieth Kansas and First Montana regiments deploying to the right and left when possible.  
Both brigades met their resistance simultaneously on approaching the river near San Tomas, which is about eight kilometers from Apalit. The center span of the railroad bridge had dropped into the river, and the rebels had only left a small force to check General Wheaton, their main body being the strong trenches in front of General Hale.  
Although the attacking force poured a very heavy artillery and musketry fire across the river, the enemy stubbornly resisted for over an hour, ultimately breaking when Major Young shelled their left flank, and then retreating along the river bank under cover.  
So soon as they discovered that the nature of the country would permit only a few skirmishes on each side of the crossings, the rebels regained their courage and fought desperately for three-quarters of an hour, in the face of the American volleys and a rapid fire fusillade, until flanked by the Montana regiment. Then a general scramble ensued, most of the enemy retreating toward the river, in readiness and the others taking the road to San Fernando, after burning the villages of San Tomas and Minalin. About noon General Wheaton crossed the broken bridge, cleared the stragglers out of the villages and advanced toward San Fernando. General Hale effected a crossing simultaneously, after a slight delay necessary to repair a stone bridge.  
Our loss up to noon was two members of the Nebraska regiment and one of the Montana killed, and Captain Albrecht, three members of the Kansas regiment, two of the Montana, four of the Nebraska and one of the South Dakota wounded. Brigadier General Funston, of the Twentieth Kansas, was wounded, one lieutenant was killed and four were wounded while leading the troops across the Kansas river to outflank the enemy. Our entire loss is very slight.

# AN INGRATE'S DOUBLE CRIME

Murdered the Daughter of the Man Who Betrayed Him.

New York, May 5.—Thomas McGrath, a private of Company E, Twenty-second regiment, mustered out of service several months ago, shot and killed Jennie Coyle, aged 21 years of age, last night in the hallway of the house where both lived at 442 Tenth avenue, and then sent a bullet into his own head.

McGrath was out of employment for a long time and Mr. Coyle, the dead girl's father, took pity on him and invited him to make his home with the family. McGrath speedily fell in love with Jennie, a comely girl, and although she reciprocated his feelings for a time later she became very angry at the girl because she had accepted an invitation from another to go to the theater. He threatened at that time to blow her brains out. McGrath last evening waited for the return of the girl from her work. He shot the door as she entered the hallway of the house, and drawing a revolver seized the girl by the throat. He fired four bullets into her head in rapid succession, blowing the side of her head off. He then sent a bullet into his own head.
