Manufacturers May Be Compelled by Lay to Print on the Labels the Kind for Preservatives Used in Putting Up the Goods.

THE PURE FOOD PROBE

Chicago, May 12.—Before the sen-ate pure food committee yesterday four prominent witnesses testified as four to the effect on the human stomach of the use of antiseptics and "embalming fluids" and preservatives in foods and drink. In general they were agreed turer and user to brand them plainly and explicitly, so that the consumer may know exactly what is being eaten. igan and professor of hygenic chem-istry; Victor C. Dr. Piffard made specific reference to foods and drugs which are being generally adulterated, sometimes with dangerous results to the consumer Brome seltzer, he said, is one of these. Properly, it should consist of bromide of potassium or some other substance of that kind and the ingredients of seltzer water.

"But it appears," he continued "that acetaniiide is being extensively used instead. In the now famous Adams case the experts' examination of the bromo showed the presence, in addition to the acute poison, of acetanilide, so that I believe its use is widespread. The commissioners made this statement at the close of the day:

"The things which seem to stick out about the details of the investigation are the facts that antiseptics are used indiscriminately and to defraud and deceive; that they are in most cases deleterious and in some positively dangerous. Second, that in the absence of explicit labels dishonest manufacturers are enabled to put spurious goods on the market. These things will be looked after in the proposed

legislation." The testimony of witnesses already heard has attracted wide attention in all parts of the country. Letters are beginning to pour in from New York. CHEERING THE VETS. Scenes of Enthusiasm at the Con-

federates' Reunion. GEN. WHEELER'S NOISY GREETING

The Little Cavalry Leader of Two Wars Deeply Affected by the Warmth of His Reception-Wade Rampton Retires to the Ranks.

Charleston, May 12 .- The Confederate Veterans held but one session yesterday, which shortly after noon gave way to the Winne Davis memorial exercises, at the conclusion of which an adjournment until 10 o'clock was taken. The announcement that General Joseph Whesler was to speak filled the auditorium.

After some routine business the feature of the day's session took place. It was General Wheeler's address, and the scene that attended his introduction was one of frantic enthusiasm. Advancing to the front of the platform General Gordon held up his hand, and absolute silence was upon the vast audience as he said;

"Comrades, I have here a real treat for you. If I should tell this convention there is here the hero of Santlago"-

General Gordon could get no further. A wild burst of applause thundered forth, rebel yells split the air and hats canes and handkerchiefs were waved as the great audience rose to its feet. Finally securing quiet General Gordon spoke of General Wheeler as "the man who at Santiago held to the front place the army and flag of America."

Again the applause burst out, and rising the assemblage continued cheering until the scene was one of the wildest that has ever marked a reunlon.

Proceeding, General Gordon declared Wheeler one of "the willest wizards of the Confederacy," and then repeated the apocryphal story of the famous little cavalryman when at Santiago he exclaimed as the Spanish lines broket "Forward, boys; the Yanks are running." Again the applause broke forth

The audience rose as General Wheeler stepped forward, apparently much affected. He wore a black Prince Albert suit, with badges on each lapel of his coat. One was yellow by chance and the other was red. He spoke de-liberately, calmly and clearly, the audience giving him close attention. His reference to the general sorrow caused by the death of Winnie Davis affected many to tears. He closed amid much applause and the orchestra played America.' Then occurred one of the most pic-

uresque incidents of the session. Genturesque incidents of the session. Gen-eral Gordon arose and advanced to the front of the stage, followed by General Wade Hampton, escorted by Colonel Holmes and Major Barker, the former bearing a beautiful silk flag, one side of which was the battleflag of the Confederacy and the reverse the state flag of South Carolina. "The whole story is a sensational canard. The only basis for it is a couple of photographic negatives, and poor ones at that, found by a messenger last Saturday while cleaning out






