

New York's Mayor Before the Mazet Investigating Committee.

HE REBUKES AN INSINUATION.

When Asked by Counsel Moss If He Knew of "a Gentleman Named Van Wyck" Being Interested in Pool Rooms He Domanded an Inquiry.

New York, May 17 .- Mayor Robert A. Van Wyck was on the witness stand yesterday before the Mazet investigating committee. Mayor Van Wyck gave it as his opinion that the conduct of affairs under the new charter has been remarkably satisfactory, but re-fused to express any opinion regarding changes in the city officers that might tend to improve the administration of the city's affairs. There was not much of note about

the mayor's testimony, and only on one occasion did he find reason to make an outbreak. Counsel Moss asked him if he knew James A. Mahoney, and the mayor said he had had business dealings with Mahoney in Texas ten or twelve years ago. He knew that Mahoney made books on the race tracks, but did not know that Mahoney was running pool rooms in New York city. The mayor had never heard that Mr. Mahoney, Mr. Carroll and Mr. Sexton were jointly interested in pool rooms. "Have you never heard," sneered


CUBAN PROSPERITY.




