THE PEACE CONFERENCE

Delegates Assembled at The Hague to Discuss Disarmament.

The Delegates Send Telegrams to the Czar and to the Young Queen of the Netherlands-M. De Staal Elected President of the Conference. The Hague, May 19.—The peace con-ference, called by the czar of Russia, was opened at 2 o'clock yesterday af-

termoon in the hall of the Huisten Bosch, or the "House in the Woods," two miles from The Hague.

M. De Beaufort, president of the council and minister of foreign affairs of the government of the Netherlands. delivered the inaugural address and welcomed the delegates. He concluded by calling attention to the allegorical group over the doorway of the hall,

'eace entering to close the temple of Janus, and said: "I trust this beautiful allegory will be a good augury of your labors, and that after you have completed them you will be able to say that Peace, whom Art introduced into this hall, left it to spread its blessings among the whole of humanity."

The delegates decided to send the following telegram to the czar: "The peace conference lays at the feet of your majesty its respectful congratulations upon the occasion of your birthday and expresses its sincere desire to co-operate in the great and noble work in which your majesty has

taken a generous initiative, and for which it begs you to accept its humble

and profound gratitude."




