THE BUFFALO STRIKERS

Now Seem Further From Settlement Than Ever.

GRAIN SHOVELERS DETERMINED.

They Again Demand the Unequivocal Abrogation of the Contract With Mr. Conners-Freight Handlers Vote to Ignore Bishop Quigley's Advice.

Buffalo, May 20.-The grain shovel-

ers last night adopted resolutions re-pudiating all agreements made with the Lake Carriers' association and demanding the unequivocal abrogation of the contract with Mr. Conners The striking freight handlers at their meeting voted to ignore the advice of Bishop Quigley, in which he urged

them to return to work under the terms granted by the Associated Lake lines at the conference yesterday afternoon. The action taken at these two meetings, it is thought, will end for some time to come the negotiations which

have been in progres for over two weeks to bring about a settlement of the dock troubles.

The grain shovelers will refuse to

make any further propositions to either the lake carriers or to the contractor, and as the lake carriers some days ago decided to withdraw from the conflict the indications are that the strike wil be permitted the wear itself out.

The final conference between Con-tractor Conners and the men was held yesterday afternoon. The men an-nounced before they took part in it that if it did not result in some agreement they would break off negotiations. At this conference the strikers proposed that there be inserted in the agreement already reached with the Lake Carriers' association a clause governing the appointment of boss scoopers. This clause provided that the grain shovelers should submit the names of ten men for each elevator, out of which list the contractor should select his boss scoopers, Mr. Conners refused to agree to this proposi-tion, and the men left the conference.

At 9 o'clock President McMahon re-ported to a meeting of grain shovelers the result of the conference. A wild scene ensued. The men poured out their wrath upon the president and the committee for having attempted to make such terms, declared they would have refused them even if the contractor had accepted them, and, in the midst of denunciations of the conractor, the committee, and even Bishop Quigley, a resolution was adopted to the effect that the executive committee representing the strikers should establish an office and wait there for the Lake Carriers' association to come to them to agree to break the contract with Mr. Conners.

Another resolution was adopted prohibiting the officers or the executive committee from negotiating further with Mr. Conners or making any advances to the Lake Carriers' associa-

THE AMERICAN SABBATH

That It Is Endangered

AND AMERICAN LIBERTY IN PERIL

Pastors, Congregations, Legislators and Congress Urged to Realize the Importance of Sabbath Observance, Aympathy With Sunday Workers.

Minneapolis, May 20 .- Sunday observance was the question which took the major part of the Presbyterian assembly's time yesterday. Most of the long afternoon session was devoted to an earnest and often excited discussion of the report of the special committee on Sabbath observance. In the end the committee's eight resolutions were adopted with slight amendments, and two more were added. In the discussion the Sunday street car, the Sunday train and railroad excursion, the Sunday newspaper, the Sunday working Presbyterian and every form of ac the literal meaning of the fourth commandment was condemned. Indignant comments were made when another special committee reported that It had not been able to keep congress and the president from granting the Roman Catholics permission to erect a chapel on the West Point Military academy In the debate on the Sabbath reso-

lutions nimost every speaker gave evidence of being imbued with the feeling expressed in the words of the com-mittee, "the American Christian Sabbath is in imminent peril; in fact, in many of our large cities and in other parts of the land, it is already nearly ost. This means that American liberty and American institutions are in peril, for of these the American Sabbath has been both the foundation and the protection."

Hathaway, secretary of the American Sabbath Union, led in the discussion and Alexander Dixon, of Scranton, Pa., Elder John Gilchrist of Boston, Dr. E. B. Wright of Austin Tex., and many others spoke in favor of literal observance of the fourth commandment. D. W. Glass, of Bal-timore, deplored Sabbath violation by Presbyterians and remarked that President Cowen, of the Baltimore and Ohio railroad, which discriminates in favor of Sunday travel, is a Presbyterian. On the other hand it was pointed out that the many down town churches would have to be closed if church members never rode to church. An attempt to get the phrase "Chris-tian Sabbath" substituted for the phrase "American Sabbath" in the resolutions was defeated.

As adopted the amendments depre cate the secularizing of the Sabbath arge members and young people of the church to realize the importance of Sabbath observance, and legislatures and congress are urged to protect the American Sabbath. Every pastor is recommended to preach on Sabbath observance on some Sabbath of next October and take a collection for the Sabbath Union; the board of publica-tion is requested to prepare and Sabbath school superintendents to use a specific Sabbath observance leaflet. Sympathy is expressed with 3,000,000 Americans who, because of Sabbath desecration, are compelled to do secu-lar work on the Sabbath. President McKinley's attention is respectfully called to the fact that employes of the postoffices and many other depart-ments of the government are compell-

ed to work on Sunday.


