

Big Atlantic Liner on the Rocks

miles from Falmouth. Soon after 1 o'clock in the morning, at high tide, and in a dense fog, she ran ashore. From the first there was no danger. Lifeboats and tugs were soon literally swarming around the vessel to render assistance. A majority of the pas-sengers, who numbered 380, were tained lodgings for the night. The crew

remains on board.

The first intimation of the vessel striking the rocks was a slight grating sound, which was followed by a second and more pronounced shock. The lookout shouted that there was something looming shead, but before there was time to reverse the engines the ship had gone on the rocks, 200 yards from the shore. Assistance was summoned by means of rockets, and the coast guards promptly telephoned to

the life saving station for boats.

A majority of the passengers were A majority of the passengers were not aware that an accident had hap-pened until they were called up by the stewards. On reaching the deck they found the ship's boats in perfect readiness for their reception. The sea was perfectly calm, and the only discomfort that the passengers experi-enced was caused by the slight rain that was falling at the time. Owing to the calmness of the sea the boats could be managed with entire safety. Perfect order prevailed aboard the vessel. Captsin Watkins stood on the bridge giving orders, and his perfect self possession and calmness of demeanor had a reassuring effect upon the passengers. In accordance with the instructions of the captain, the wo-men and children were the first to be taken off the ship. Such perfect order was maintained that a passenger described the scene as simply a slow procession of women and children walking in single file to the boats.

It is said that a Falmouth pilot boat

showed a warning signal to the Paris, telling the captain that he would put the vessel on top of the Mohegan if he did not alter the course of the ship. The warning, however, came too late and the Paris struck on a ridge to the westward of the Manacies. It is believed that the steamer has a


