In 1856 Castelar was the successful competitor for the chair of history and philosophy in the Uni-versity of Madrid. He was deprived of his university profesorabily in 1864, after having, with Senor Carascon, founded the Journal La Democracia. Castelar paved the way by his writlags and speeches for the revolution of 1866, which was put down by Marshal Serrano. He was sentenced to death and his paper suppressed. In dis-guise he escaped to Geneva and thence to France. o France.

Castelar was restored to his professor-Amadeo

When King Amadeo abdicated, in 1873, Castelar became minister of for-eign affairs to the republic (Feb. 12) and president of Spain, with extraor-dinary powers (Sept. 7). On Jan. 2, 1874, he resigned. Serrano came to the front in the military reaction, and a year later, when Alfonso XII was called to the throne, Castelar made a second journey to Geneva. In 1876 he re-entered the cortes.

Insist on Discussing Matters Not Mentioned by Count Muravieff. The Hagne, May 25.—Mme. Selenka, the famous peace advocate and pro-motor of the woman's peace crusade, yesterday presented to M. De Staal, yesterday presented to M. De Staal, head of the Russian delegation, an illustrated album containing the text hopes of the people might not be de-ceived and that the conference would decide that the evils of war could be cured. The address concluded as follows: "Your sisters, on behalf of hu-manity, appeal to you to realize the ideal of fraternity, in order that war and tyranny may perish with the cen-

tury." M. De Staal had written Mme. Selenka that he could receive her for five minutes, but he was so interested that he kept her for half an hour. "Carmen Sylva" (Queen Elizabeth of Roumania) contributed a posm to the album, and Queen Wilhelmina sent one of her secretaries to congratulate Mme. Selenka on the work of the associations.

Both sections of the committee on the laws of warfare of the peace conference met separately yesterday and began the examination of the subject submitted to them, the Red Cross see submitted to them, the Red Cross sec-tion discussing paragraphs 5 and 6 of the circular of Count Muravief, Rum-sian minister of foreign affairs, and the Brussels conference section dis-cussing paragraph 7. Both sections met subsequently and discussed the question of competence, as regards the scheme for the revision of the Generac convention known as

of the Geneva convention, known as the Morgnier scheme.

The Morgnier scheme comprises modifications of the Geneva convention in connection with wounded and sick prisoners, members of the military hospital service, convoys for the wounded, ambulances, hospitals, property belong-ing to neutralized persons, religious and medical staffs and kindred subjects. The scheme applies equally to land and sea warfare.

It was proposed to submit the scheme to another committee for revision, and the question was then raised whether the conference was competent to deal with the matter. Those who took a negative view argued that the conference had decided in principle, and all the governments represented had agreed, that nothing should be submitted to the conference beyond the eight points in the circular of Count Muravieff. They con-tended that if the conference once infringed this rule a precedent would be created leading to numerous difficulties, including probably the spring-ing of the Armenian, Macedonian and similar questions upon the conference. It was also pointed out by the oppo-

nents of the proposal to refer that, in-asmuch as the Morgnier scheme dealt mostly with the wounded and with hospitals, it would be impossible to discuss the proposed modifications ef-fectively without the co-operation of doctors, who alone would be capable of deciding many of the points in issue. As a matter of fact there is no man of medical training among the delegates.






