The Two American Officers Previously Reported Missing.

PUTILE EFFORT TO RESCUE THEM

The Men Were Quickly Rushed Into the Woods Before Our Sallors Could Land-Lieutenant Gillmore and His PartyWell, Says an Escaped Prisoner

Manila, June 1.-Details regarding Manila, June 1.—Details regarding the capture by Filipinos of two officers of the United States hospital ship Relief on Tuesday have just been obtained. The Relief lies in the harbor in front of the city. Third Officer Fred Heppy and Assistant Engineer Charles Blandford rigged a sail on one of the ship's boats and went salling along the shore on the south expects. along the shore, on the south, opposite the insurgent lines. The boat became becamed near the shore, and some native cances with Filipines on board put out and captured the two men, who were unarmed, and also took pos-session of the boat. The United States turret ship Monadnock quickly sent a boat with a landing party sabore, un-der cover of her guns, and shelled the shore briskly. The natives, however, rushed the prisoners into the woods before the Monadnock boat reached land. Persons on board several other ships saw the affair through glasses but were unable to prevent the capture of Messrs. Heppy and Blandford. Friendly natives arriving here from

the country around San Isidro and San Miguel report that a reign of terror has prevailed since the American troops were withdrawn from those those parts of the islands. The insurgents who are returning there deal vengeance upon those of their country-men who have shown any friendship towards the Americans during the lat-ter's occupation of the territory. The friendlies declare that unoffending peo-ple are being murdered daily, and that their houses are being burned and their property confiscated. Plenty of sympathizers with the insurrection re-mained during the Americans stay and they have been reporting these instances of friendliness towards our troops

The refugees add that the inhabi-tants were badly oppressed by the native soldiers before the American occupation, but that their condition is worse now. Doubtless there is much truth in these reports, though such stories from Filipino sources are al-



A deeper reason was to inflict a blow on the republic, and especially upon the president, who insists that the government must not meddle with the Drey-fus case, but must leave it to the court of cassation.




