UNRECONSTRUCTED CUBAN BAND

Hended by Jose Manuel Guerra, s Mulatto Captain, They Are Encamp ed Between Bincon and Santiago de las Vegas.

Havana, June 2 .- Governor General Brooke and the governors of the mili-tary departments had a conference lasting three hours yesterday regard ing the general situation in the island. They then had luncheon together, after which another two hours were or cupied with a less formal discussion. The principal topic was how to re-vive agricultural life and how to give work instead of food to the destitute. The propriety of buying oxen and implements was strongly urged by Gen-eral Wilson, governor of the Matan-zas-Santa Clara department, and his arguments received full consideration. A majority of the conference, however, was rather opposed to this plan, and no definite conclusions were reached. But the full exchange of views will

probably result in greater uniformity of administration. Patricio Valdez and Antonio Perez, citizens of Havana, say that on Mon-day, while in search of work, they found no work there, but a Cuban cap-tain gave them food and a night's lodging, and on the next day they resumed their search. Eventually they arrived at the plantation Delicias, between Rincon and Santiago de las Vegas, which they entered with the intention of gathering fruit. Suddenly they came upon men in drill suits, without insignias, evidently sentinels. Whistles were blown, and others emerged from the bushes. A tall mulatto, called Captain Guerra, gave Valdez and Perez food, afterward asking them whether they wanted to join his they refused to do. At the house there were good horses, and the party, which numbered about 90, had a flag, This a small duplicate of the Spaniah flag, except that, instead of arms, it bore a triangle enclosing the letters "U. N. O." The men were well armed and ap-

parently had money. Cubans in Havana say that Jose Manuel Guerra, a mulatto captain who disappeared from the army last April. answers the description given of the leader of the band.






