ENOUGH PLEDGES NOW SECURED

And Many More to Hear From, Ineluding Twenty Votes From Penusylvania, Induces the Republican Summer Leader to Suspend Canvassing.

Chicago, June 5 .- Congressman David B. Henderson, of lown, yesterday received enough pledges, by telegraph and mail, to give him 102 votes in the Republican caucus when it meets in Washington. As 93 votes constitute a majority of the Republican representation in the house, Colonel Hen-
