Washington Soldiers Advance in the Face of a Heavy Fire.

AND PUT THE REBELS TO FLIGHT.

The Men of the Signal Service Display Signal Bravery in Placing Wires in the Extreme Front-Twenty-nine Telegraph Offices Established.

Manila, June 6.-Two battalions of the Washington troops, nader Colonel Whalley, on board cascoes, were towed from Pasig to Morong on Sunday and landed under cover of a well directed fire from the "tinclad" army gunboats Napidan and Covadonga,

The rebels, who were intrenched in the outskirts of the town, reserved their fire until the troops were ashore and in the open.

The American artillery opened fire on the insurgents and drove them from their positions, killing nine of them and wounding five.

The Washington troops then took the town, the insurgents fleeing to the hills.

While the Americans were on their way to Morong the insurgents opened fire from a shore battery at Ancona, their first shot striking the Covadonga's awning aft at a range of 3,500

The Napidan also was fired at. Reports from the chief signal officer at Manila and from Major A. G. Devoe, of the quartermaster's department have been forwarded to Washington. The report of the signal officer sketches in considerable detail the work of the signal corps in the islands, and speaks in terms of high praise of the work both officers and men.

There were many instances of rapid work, and distinguished bravery on the part of officers in the fight at Caloocan. where the laying of a long line of wire was necessary. A signal office was set up at the extreme front, and was doing siness in a few minutes after the action ceased.

In the fight at Tondo an office was spened and doing business in the heart of the burning town before any attempt was made to put out the fire.

Increased by the Ruffianly Attack of Aristocratic Hoodlums.

HE WILL NOT BE FORCED OUT.

The Chamber of Deputies Supports the Government and Delays the Mercler Inquiry Until After Dreyfus' Trial. Countess Castellane's Donial.

Paris, June 6.—An order of the day was yesterday accepted by the government, stigmatizing the occurrences at Autenil and approving the declarations of the government. It was carried without a division after the first part had been adopted by a vote of 513 to 32 and the second part had been voted by 326 to 173. The chamber, by 299 to 238 votes,

decided to adjourn the appointment of a commission of inquiry into the con-duct of General Mercier, the former minister of war, until after the court martial at Rennes, which is to try Dreyfus, as a result of the decision of the court of cassation

There were violent scenes in the chamber of deuties, owing to Royalist demunciations of President Loubet, and the soldiers on duty had to expel the chief unti-Loubet speaker, M. Rieus The prefect of police, M. Blanc, has

ordered the closure of the Automobile Club de France, of which the Comto de Dion, who was one of the ringleaders at Auteuil Sunday, is president. A police commissary thereupon proceeded to the club's premises, on the Place de La Concorde, and cleared the members out, after which he af-fixed scale to the doors.

Vigorous mensures have been taken to suppress demonstrations. Mounted detachments of Republican Guards have been stationed about the Place de La Concorde, in the Rue de L'Elysee and in the Rue des Tuileries.

The municipal council yesterday afternoon discussed the Auteuil affair, and M. Blanc, prefect of police, announced that 50 of those under arrest would be prosecuted for insulting the president. He animadverted severely pon the cowardice of Count Chris tiani, who now pretends that he struck the president by accident in his attempt to escape from the melee. The council unanimously adopted a resolution expressing its abhorrence of tha insulting demonstration and its respectful sympathy with and confi-

Lieutenant Guelard has been arrested and charged not only with ut-tering seditious cries, but with as-saulting M. Touny, chief of the mu-

Socialist and Radical deputies in the lobbies of the chamber eagerly discussed the measures adopted by the cabinet and criticized them as inade-quate. They demand the closure of all Royalist clubs. The decision with reference to General Mercler caused

great surprise.

The Republican deputies of all shades of opinion have sent President Loubet an address assuring him of their respectful esteem and of their

devotion to republican institutions. The scenes at Auteuil on Sunday and in the chamber of deputies yesterday have only had the effect of increasing the popularity of President Loubet and of strengthening the hands of the goverament. The promptitude of the pre-mier, M. Dupuy, in carrying out his premise to take measures to insure ustice as soon as the court of cassation had pronounced judgment is regarded as proving that he himself can show a clean bill and that, though he was premier at the time, General Mercler kept him ignorant of the measures

adopted against Dreyfus. Interviews with various high personages who witnessed the incident at Auteuil are published, all testifying to the savagery of the demonstration. It is asserted that, although the price of admission to the paddock was 20 francs, this was full of coachmen, footmen and valets, evidently sent

there to create a disturbance.

The papers praise the calmness of President Loubet throughout the dem-onstration against him. In replying to the stewards of the Auteuil races,

"You are in no way responsible, and to prove that I have no anger with you if there were races tomorrow I would attend them. I am invited to witness the Grand Prix on Sunday next, and you may be sure I will be present."
On his return to the Elysee M. Loubet said to those who accompanied

"All of my family opposed my be-coming president, and I had no desire to remain at the Elysee, but now that it is dangerous to be the chief of state my duty is clear, and I will let my enemies, if I have any, be convinced that I shall accomplish my mission to the end."

Of the 130 persons arrested in connection with the demonstration 43 are still held in custody.

M. Le Mercier, the examining mag-istrate, last night began the interro-gation of those under arrest for par-ticipating in Sunday's rioting. Ten, including M. De Fannizz Passy, have been provisionally released. About 15 will be prosecuted on charge of rebel-lion, for which the maximum punishment is five years' imprisonm

The charge against Comte Christiani is of assaulting a magistrate while in the exercise of his functions, an offense punishable by imprisonment for from two to five years.

Denial From the Count and Countess Paris, June 6.—Comte and Comtesse Boni de Castellane assure the correspondents of the American papers that there is no truth in the statement that the comtesse was mixed up in the rioting on the Auteuil race course on Sunday. The comtesse was disagree-ably surprised to see her name con-nected with the affair. The story originally appeared in La Presee, of this city, which said it had received the information from a source usually reliable.
