GOOD ADVICE TO THE CUBANS.

"We Must Make Useless by Our Behavior the Presence of a Strange Power,and Must Assist Americans to Complete Their Honorable Mission." Havana, June 7 .-- General Maximo Gomez, former commander-in-chief of the Cuban army, issued his farewell manifesto yesterday. In substance it 出出学师:

"The mission I have been entrusted with is nearly concluded. I have attempted to find a solution of questions concerning the army which I commanded during the bloodiest war known in America. I am now leaving, regretfully, to attend to necessary private business.

"A parting word to the people for whom I have sacrificed 30 years of my life and to my friends in the army just disbanded, which action should have been taken instantly after the removal of the bloody weight of Spain's merciiess regime. We armed ourselves, and therefore we no longer want soldiers, but men for the maintenance of peace and order, which are the basis of Cuba's future welfare.

"We wanted and depended upon forsign intervention to terminate the war. This occurred at the most terrible monent of our contest, and resulted in Spain's defeat. But none of us thought this extraordinary event would be followed by a military occupation of the country by our allies, who treat us as a people incapable of acting for ourselves, and who have reduced us to obedience, to submission and to a tutelage imposed by force of circumstances. This cannot be our ultimate fate after the years of struggle, and we should aid in every pacific method in finishing the work of organizing, which the Americans accepted in the protocol, and which is as disagreeable for them as for ourselves. This aid will prove useless without concord among all the islanders.

We must make useless by our behavior the presence of a strange power in the island and must assist the Amercans to complete the honorable mission they have been compelled to as-sume by force of circumstances. This work was not sought by those rich northerners, owners of a continent. I think doubts and suspicions are unust. We must form immediately a committee or club to be a nucleus of a government. This will serve Cuban interests purely and act as an aid to

the intervenors. "I, as one of the first Cubans, although one of our last old soldiers, and not far from the grave, without passons or ambitions, call on you with the sincerity of a father and urge a cessation of the superfluous discussions and the creation of parties of all kinds, which disturb the country and tend to cause anarchy. "My mission having ended, I will

absent myself, temporarily, to embrace my family, but I will return shortly to Cuba, which I love as much as my own land."



BATTLES WITH ROBBERS

Sherlff Hazen Killed While Attempting a Capture.

THE OUTLAWS HOTLY PURSUED.

After Making Two Desperate Stands the Train Robbers Escape in the Darkness on Stolen Herses-Their Ultimate Capture Assured.

Cheyenne, Wyo., June 7 .- A second attie with the dynamiters of the Union Pacific express train has been lought in the mountains 40 miles north of Casper by the sheriff's posse which has been in pursuit since Sunday morning, and as a result one man and probably more are dead. The first battle was fought Sunday on Teapot creek, 39 miles north of Casper. No one was wounded during the engage-ment, but several horses were killed. The second battle was fought at a point ten miles farther north and in a wild country. The robbers, being closely pursued, made a desperate stand behind some rocks in a deep ravine, and when the posse put in an

appearance opened firs at close range. Sheriff Joe Hazen, of Douglas, Wyo., fell at the first fire, being shot through the stomach. The officer was removed to a safe place and afterwards brought to Casper by two cowboys, arriving at the latter place yesterdaynoon. Thence he was taken in a train to his home at test." Douglas, but died soon afterward. The posse resumed the fight as soon

as Hazen had been removed, and was successful in a short time in driving the robbers from their stronghold and away from their horses, which were The robbers retreated to a natural fort among the rocks some two miles away, where they entrenched themselves and prepared for a bilter fight. The posse quietly divided up and surrounded the place, and when the courier left the scene the officers were lying on their arms, with the robbers completely hemmed in. An urgent request was sent in for reinforcements and a supply of food and ammunition. In response United States Marshal Hadsell, of Wyoming, who had just reached Casper from the western part of the state, where he had been hunting for the other three train robbers started on with another posse with arms, food, ammunition and horses in plenty.

Later dispatches say that the outlaws escaped through the lines of the posse in the intense darkness of the night. They stole the horses of a freighting outfit and fied for the Hole-In-the-Wall. Sixty-five men under Uni-ted States Marshal Hadsell took up the trail, and are in pursuit. The three outlaws are Bob Taylor, of the Hole-inthe-Wall band, a Mexican and a Casper gambler named Cavanaugh.




