Terrible Landslide Reported in a Railroad Cut in Arkansas.

Little Rock, June 9.-It is reported here that a landslide occurred at Ross Hollow and engulfed 28 men, all of whom are supposed to have been killed. Ross Hollow is a pass between two small mountain ranges about 28 mlles west of Little Rock, on the line of the Choctaw and Memphis road, of the Choctaw and Memphis road, now under construction from Little Rock to Howe, I. 
