



M. WALDECK-ROUSSEAU TRIES IT M. Doleanse, Who Was Called After

the Fatture of Poincare, Declined te Make the Attempt-Radical Domands Were Too Much For Poincare.

Paris, June 17 .-- M. Poincare vesterday went to the Elysee palace and in-formed President Loubet that he would make no further effort to form a min-istry. M. Poincare's decision was reached after a long conference with MM. Brisson, Sarrien and Mougeo', Radicals, who finally refused to agree to the conditions on which M. Polucare offered them representation in the

cabinet. M. Poincare complains bitterly that



M. POINCARE. the Radicals, but they wanted, he says, to have everything in their own hands. He declares he has enough of cabinet making and will not be in a hurry to return to the task. After M. Poincare had left the presi

dent summoned M. Delcasse, who de-clined to attempt the formation of a ministry. Then Senator Waldeck-Rosseau was summoned, and he accepted the task.

It is believed that strong pressure was brought to bear upon M. Waldeck-Rosseau, but as the Socialists and Radicals virtually dominate the situation, no combination is likely to be long lived.






