

# WOMEN AID RIOTERS.

A Cleveland Street Car Attacked by Over Two Thousand.

MOTORMAN SERIOUSLY INJURED.

The City Council Passes an Ordinance Urged by the Union Men-Battroad President Declares Some of the Men Can Never Be Re-employed.

Cieveland, June 20.—Up to 4 o'clock in the afternoon yesterday promised to be the most uneventful day in the big street railroad strike. At that hour another serious riot broke out in an entirely new quarter, and one nonunion man was sent to the hospital in consequence.

The company began yesterday the operation of two new lines, those on Scovill and Central avenues. The tars were protected by policemen, and until afternoop no trouble occurred. Just before 4 o'clock two of the Scovill cars approached the crossing of the Pennsylvania railroad. There were met by a mob of more than 2,000 men and women. One of the cars was taken across the railroad safely, but the other was held up by the mob. A perfect shower of paving bricks and stones fell about the car and crashed against the vestibule at the front end, behind which the motorman was coucealed.

A resolution was also adopted requesting the corporation counsel to report whether the franchises of the company could forfeited if it failed to run cars on all its lines. Several other resolu-tions were offered and referred to committees. A special meeting of the council is to be held tomorrow evening, and in the meantime a committee which was appointed last night, will seek to bring about a settlement of the

The leader of the strike said today that about the only question at issue now was whether all the old men would be reinstated if the strike was declared off. The demand for absolute recognition of the union appears to have been abandoned. President Everett says he cannot agree to take back all men, for some of them will never be reinstated.

SIX MEN BOUND AND GAGGED.

Then the Safe Was Broken Open and the Gang Escaped With Two Day's Receipts-Three Men Arrested and Held on Suspicion.

Philadelphia, June 20.—Shortly beore I o'clock yesterday morning, when the safe of the Fairmount Park Transportation commany, located in the recelving office at Belmont, was filled with the receipts of two days, amounting in exact figures to \$3,300.55, a gang of masked cracksmen, numbering about en or twelve, swooped down upon the place and stole the money, after holding up the receiver and five other men, binding them hard and fast with pic-ture card. The mouths of the captured men were gagged with rags.

The time and place chosen by the bandits were both perfectly adapted or the desperate work in hand. The ar barn of the trolley company is lo-

cated at Gionside, midway between the river and Belmont Manston, in the avine leading down from the plateau f Belmont to the Schuylkill. The uilding is embowered in heavy timer land, and at that early hour is as onely and as far removed from the housand miles away.

Not only were members of the gang

t the immediate scene of the robbers ut it is a fact that pickets were oper ding miles away, destroying telegraph and telephone wires at the terminus of the park trolley, so as to insure the defeat of any communication which the trolley employes would be likely send to the detective bureau.

The employes overpowered by the bandita were Frank Levan, night receiver, Philip Even, night electrician; Henry Whitehouse, assistant electrician; William Cademus, night watch-man, and C. Harry Watson, a conduc-

police three men were arrested later in the day in the park on suspicion of seing connected in some way with the cobbery. At a hearing before Magistrate South the men gave their names and addresses as Poter Duffert and Charles Smith, of Newark, N. J., and Albert Leeds, of Twentieth street and Albert Leeds, of I wentleth street and Ridge avenue. Duffert and Smith said they were tramping from Reading to Baltimore. 
