Sharp Controversy Between Russian and American Delogates Regarding the Inhumanity of Asphysiating Gases and Submarine Torpedo Boats.



What a strange commentary on a humanitariam conference that one of its results may very well be the introduction of a more cruel missile than any at present in use

At least the eccentricities of today's debate have almost put matters in that absurd light.



# CABINET COMPLETED.

M. Waldeck-Rosseau Is the New French Premier.

WAR MINISTER FAVORS DREYFUS

Though Having Monarchical Sympathios, He Declares That the Army Is. "Talking Too Much"-The Minister

of Commerce a Radical Socialist. Paris, June 23 .- Senator Waldock

Rousseau was called to the Elyses palace yesterday, where President Lou-bet proposed that he form a cabinet immediately. The senator accepted the task, and last evening, accompanied by the new cubinet ministers, proceeded to the Elysse palace and presented his colleagues to the president. The first meeting of the new cabinet will be held today.

The new cabinet is as follows; ator Waldeck-Rousseau, president of the council of ministers and minister of the interior; M. Deleasse, foreign af-fars; General the Marquis De Gallifet, war; M. De Lancasan, marine; M. Mobs, justice; M. Caillaux, finance; M. Millerand, commerce; M. Leygues, pub-lic instruction; M. Decrais, the colonles; M. Jean Dupuy, agriculture; M. Pierre Baudin, public works. The appointment of General the Mar-

quis de Gallifet as minister of war is an extraordinary example of the way in which the Drayfus case has revolutionized political conditions. For years past the general has been the bugaboo of the extremists, not only because of his monarchical sympathies, but on account of the rigorous manner in which he took part in repressing the commune. His entry into the cabinet is undoubtedly due to his attitude to-wards the Droyfus case, which has been throughout favorable to Dreyfus, although he holds that the proclama-tion of the prisoner's innocence should not include placing the responsibility for the apparent judicial blunders upon the general staff.

It was generally believed, after the conference of the representatives of the company and the committee of the strikers was concluded, that the end of the strike would come this morning and the action of the strikers last night came as a surprise. After rejecting the proposition of the company the strikers began the work of drawing up a proposition of their own, which will be submitted to the council committee today.




