

Newport, R. I., June 26.-The first trial trip of the new American cup de-fender Columbia, which took place in

Before the Columbia left for Bristol after the race Mr. Iselin expressed himself as being more than pleased with her, and it was a happy lot of yachtsmen that watched her performance and went to Bristol with her last night.

# THE COLLEGE OARSMEN.

The Crews of Cornell, Columbia, Pennsylvania and Wisconstullave Devoted Every Minute of Their Time in Preparing For the Effort of Their Lives.

Poughkeepsie, N. Y., June 26 .- All indications point to a lowering of the intercollegiate world's record for four miles for eight cared shell when the crews of Columbia, Cornell, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin meet on this river tomorrow, for never in the history of this now famous course have the crews seemed to be so evenly matched as are those here at present. 

nia, Cornell and Columbia are in splendid condition, and the two mile AFTER race will be done in fast time. This is always an exciting race, because its brevity gives a chance for a display of dash and spurt rowing not possible in the long four mile race of the senior eights. The pair oared race will be

rowed over the two mile course also. The Poughkeepsle 'varaity course of four miles runs along the west side of the river, in the shadow of the high hills, and begins at a point three miles above the Poughkeepsie bridge, fin-ishing a mile below. It is as straight as a tightly drawn line could be, and the current of the river affects it but little if the race is not rowed at a time when the up tide makes a swirl in the shallow waters. The miles are marked with big round white disks and the entire race is visible from an observation train, which runs on the west side of the river. The two mile course for the four oared and freshmen eight is rowed from the two mile point of the course to the finish.

The four miles stretch of water which has come to be known as the Poughkeepsic course has been the scene of the most important college boat races that have over been rowed within the past four years, or since 1895, when the course was first brought to public notice through its selection for the triangular race between Cor-nell, Columbia and Pennsylvania universities.

The course holds the world's record of four miles, it having been estab-lished by Cornell in 1896, when the ithacans traveled the four miles in 19 minutes and 29 seconds.

The Poughkeepsie course was selected for the race of 1895, after the city council of Philadelphia had refused to pay the expenses of the crews for holding it chere. Three years before that a proposal had been made by some gentlemen of Poughkeepsie interested in rowing to have Columbia, Cornell and Pennsylvania row their triangular race here, but as Columbia did not put a crew on the water that year the proposition did not come to a focus. The race of 1895 was set for June 21,

but it had to be postponed because of the swamping of Pennsylvania's shell by swells from the tug J. C. Hart, with Governor Morton on board. This is the only postponement that has oc-curred on this course since its selection
