The Race Was From Brenton's Reof Lightship to New London, and Included a Beat of Thirty-two Miles to Windward to a Stiff Breeze.

New London, Conn., June 29 .- In a 38 mile beat to windward yesterday the new yacht Columbia beat the old cup champion Defender eight minutes. beside giving the old champion a two minute handleap. Yachtsmen from New York and herenbouts are jubilant. for the yacht's sterling qualities must come out in a race to windward. The race was from Brenton's reef lightship, off Newport, to New London. Thirty-two miles of the long stretch of water was a beat to windward, with a stiff breeze blowing. The distance, including the long beat to windward, was

covered in a little over three hours. Neither yacht carried a working topsall, and it was in this kind of work that Columbia gained such a long lead, averaging more than a quarter of a minute faster each mile than the Defender. The water was very rough, but the new boat rode very easily and did not buffet the waves as much as the Defender.

The great white yachts made a splendid picture as they raced up the bay, their enormous salis bellying out with the strong breeze from over the quar-ter and with the water curing away

from their sharp bows.

Off the Pequot the Columbia dropped her jib and forestaysall and let go her anchor well out in the stream. The before anchored near her. Both boats were salled skillfully. After the first ten miles the race was un-interesting to watch, for Columbia had in that short distance worked out into a fine windward position and gained steadily on the Defender.
