The Much Abused Officer Declares He Bears No Ill Will.

Parts, July 1.-Captain Coffinieres de Nordeck, commander of the French cruiser Sfax, which brought Captain Dreyfus to France, said in an interview that he was struck by the Im mense power of self control displayed by Captain Dreyfus during the voyage.
