Consolidation of Wrought Steel, Iron and Tube Industries. New York, suly 13.—Consolidation of the wrought steel, iron and tube in-dustries of the country was effected yesterday by William N. Cromwell and Edmund C. Converse, the consolidation purchasers. The new company will be known as the National Tube company. It is the largest of the kind in the world, and is the third in rank as a steel and Iron corporation. It is ceeded by only the Krupp and Car-

Besides controlling the domestic ousiness the new combine will invade the Russian, Bulgarian, Japanese and Canadian market, where it already supplies tubular goods for the oil wells of those countries. It will sell merchant pipes to all the other nations of the world. Twenty-five thousand men are employed

William Nelson Cromwell, general counsel for the combine, said today that the net carnings of the current year will be between \$6,000,000 and \$7,-000,000, while the annual saving in general expenses will be from \$2,000,000,000 to \$3,000,000. The capitalisation is \$80,000,000, divided into 7 per cent cumulative preferred clock of \$40,000,000 and common stack of the save. 000 and common stock of the same amount. "In Europe I found that there was no sympathy for Spain on account of her defeat in the late war. othing but curiosity about the United States. We should bend every nergy and send such a force to the Philippines as would crush out these ebels in less than six weeks' time The war should be carried on in such a way as to drive Aguinaldo and his crew into submission, or into the sea.'

The Paris at Falmouth. Falmouth, England, July 13. - The American line steamer Paris was brought up to this harbor last night, and now lies on an unexposed sand beach in the barbor, where temporary repairs will be made before the vessel is taken to Southampton for a thorigh overhauling.
