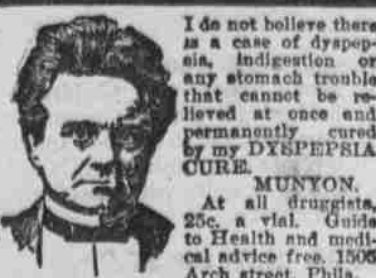

BACK FROM PHILIPPINES

Oregon Volunteer Regiments Arrive at San Francisco.

SOLDIERS WILDLY WELCOMED.

A Fleet of Vessels of All Descriptions, including Rowboats, Started For the Golden Gate as Soon as the Transports Were Stabled.

San Francisco, July 13.—The United States transports Newport and Ohio, bearing the Oregon volunteer regiments from Manila, arrived here last night. The vessels were sighted early in the afternoon, and soon the shrieking of steam whistles and the clanging of bells and the firing of cannon announced that the first batch of returning volunteers from Manila were nearing the shores of California. Within a few minutes the streets were thronged with people wending their way to the docks and to the heights overlooking the bay, intent upon catching a glimpse of the transports as they steamed up the harbor under the escort of a score of vessels which had been made ready for the arrival of the stonewalls.

The crews of the warehouses were crowded with people, and from scores of flagpoles streamed the Stars and Stripes. Steamers, tugs, yachts and even small rowboats were soon making their way as fast as possible toward the Golden Gate. The reception committees boarded the tugboats Sea Queen and Governor Jewell, and headed for the ocean. On board the Jewell were the harbor commissioners, the officials of the National Guard of California and Governor Geer, of Oregon, and his staff. On the Sea Queen were the representatives of the press, the hand furnished by Mayor Phelan, and many invited guests. The revenue cutter Golden Gate, bearing federal officials, was soon under way, and she was joined by the federal quarantine boat from Angel Island. Then there were boats at the disposal of the Red Cross and others and many chartered by private parties.

As the transports slowly steamed up the harbor the soldiers gathered in excited groups on deck and some climbed into the rigging, where they shouted and cheered like mad. The hand on the Sea Queen played patriotic airs and the screaming of many steam whistles created a pandemonium.

The health officials boarded the vessels, which changed their course toward the quarantine stations, where the doctors will make a thorough examination of the men. It is yet undecided whether the Oregon volunteers will be allowed to land in San Francisco before returning to their Oregon homes.

There is the greatest activity among newspaper men to get an opportunity to interview the returning soldiers, as they declare that the real truth regarding the situation in the Philippine Islands will be known.

Natural Gas Causes Serious Fire.

Pittsburg, July 13.—Fire in the Ritter-Conley manufacturing plant in Allegheny last night caused a loss of about \$150,000, fully covered by insurance. The cause of the fire is believed to be an explosion of natural gas in the boiler room. The machine shop was partially destroyed, the blacksmith shop completely gutted and the structural iron shop totally wrecked. It is estimated that the fire burned over an area of three-quarters of an acre.

AGUINALDO'S APPEAL MADE.

His Speech at the Recent Celebration at Manila.

PHILIPPINES FOR THE FILIPINOS.

In a Speech to Cubans General Aguinaldo Gomez Declares That Revolution Will Inevitably Return Unless Cuba is Declared Independent.

Manila, July 13.—A copy of the Independence has reached Manila containing a speech which Aguinaldo made during the recent celebration at Manila of the anniversary of the proclamation of Philippine independence. It is in part as follows:

"Philippines—beloved daughter of the ardent sun of the tropics, commended by providence to the care of noble Spain, be not ungrateful to her who warmed you with the breath of her own culture and civilization. It is true she sought to crush thy aspiration for independence, as a loving mother would do, but she failed. She sought to crush thee by the aid of the daughter of her bosom. This but proves the excess of affection and love Spain feels for thee.

"Philippines, delicate flower of the east, scarcely eight months weaned from the breast of thy mother, thou hast dared to brave a great and powerful nation, Manila to seek means to bring about little array. Yet we reply, we will be slaves to none, nor allow ourselves to be deceived by soft words. Let us continue to defend our fatherland until independence is assured for this is our aspiration. We shall see to it that the great American nation will acknowledge the right which is on our side. That doctrine of the great Monroe, that America is for Americans, is not forgotten. Just as we affirm that the Philippines are for the Philippines.

"Some states of the American Union have risen in our favor. Especially is the Democratic party convinced that both victors and vanquished will lose precious lives. Thus many of the people and many statesmen condemn President McKinley as inhuman for having ordered his military representatives at Manila to seek means to bring about hostilities with the Filipinos. These facts prove that they wished to try us to see if we are able to live up to the second color of our banner, red, which signifies courage, heroism and martyrdom.

"In spite of their expressed desire to dominate all the Philippines, well convinced are they that we fight with justice and right on our side and that autonomy is all a show of deceit, only serving to save certain accumulated wealth. We have never concealed our aspirations, that we aspire not to independence, that we will struggle on to obtain it, perhaps from those who are now our enemies and tomorrow will be our allies, as they were for the overthrow of the power of Spain."

INDEPENDENCE FOR CUBA.

Without It, Declares a Leader. Revolution Will Inevitably Follow.

Havana, July 13.—At a meeting in the Payret theater, after the street demonstration and parade in his honor, Juan Gualberto Gomez was himself the principal speaker. In the course of a long address dealing with the reasons for beginning the war against Spain he said:

"I am now, as I always have been, a separatist and I still demand the separation that I asked before the war. Not only separation from Spain, but from any and all other nations. People only begin a revolution when this is absolutely necessary to life and progress. If a superior force fetters them before their object is attained there is merely the question of delay.

"The revolution will inevitably return. The destiny of Cuba is only independence. The basic idea of the revolution were no mystery, and therefore a synopsis now, which would recall the reasons for the outbreak and of incidents only to be recalled with horror, is unnecessary. Still, we would return to those direful days if it had to be. Honor is as much a necessity in national life as food in the life of the individual, and it ought to be insured, if possible, even though the attempt may result in catastrophes and death.

"We should give due thanks to the Americans, but this does not mean that we should resign ourselves to a tutelage to be exercised over us. Let us make the same statement to the United States and the American colonies made to England when they declared, in 1776, that the Americans owned North America."

The entire speech was in this spirit. The local press praises it as "the most important occurrence since Jan. 1." Most of those present at the meeting were negroes, and many of the banners borne in the procession showed the legend, "Independence or Death."

Wheeler to Return by December.

Chicago, July 13.—General Joseph H. Wheeler passed through Chicago yesterday, bound for the Philippines on an unknown mission. As he put it himself: "I am ordered merely to report to General Otis and do not know what I shall have to do when I get there. I expect to return by December, when congress meets." Miss Annie Wheeler, the general's daughter, accompanied him to Manila. She goes out as a Red Cross nurse without pay, and intends to remain so long as her health permits or her services are needed.

AN APPEAL FROM TEXAS.

Aid Needed For the Sufferers by the Heaviest Great Flood Ever.

Washington, July 13.—Representative R. E. Hawley, of Texas, who is now in Washington, makes public the following statement with reference to the flood situation in that state.

"The disaster which has overtaken the communities in Southern Texas is without parallel in our country, resulting in no less than 20 populous towns being inundated, as well as thousands of well established and well ordered farms, which today are in a complete state of desolation. Practically every work animal, every milk cow, together with all stock cattle and every vestige of vegetation, have been swept away, leaving the country completely devastated. The money loss is from \$25,000,000 to \$40,000,000.

"Within the influence of this awful disaster resided over 100,000 people, almost half of whom are in a state of helplessness today, except as they may be provided for by those who are generous and able to assist them. The whole state of Texas is alive to the situation, and is doing its utmost to relieve the suffering. It is, however, impossible for the state alone, within the time necessary to assist the sufferers. When the great Johnstown flood occurred Pennsylvania could have easily taken care of their own if given time, but as time was, as it is now, the essential factor, they were obliged to appeal to a generous public in every part of the United States.

"To this public the flood district of Texas appeals to supply the necessities of life until the horrors of the flood shall have passed. For the distribution of this relief a system is being organized throughout the flooded district immediately under the direction of the governor of Texas, to whom all contributions should be addressed."
