

TWO LIVES. A WHOLESALE LYNCHING

Five Sicilians Strung Up by a Mob in Louisiana.

HAD FATALLY SHOT A DOCTOR.

The Whole Trouble Precipitated in a Quarrel Over Goats Trespassing on Doctor's Premises-Citizens Pleaded Value For the Lives of the Men.

Tallulah, La., July 22.—Five Sicilians were lynched here Thursday night for the fatal wounding of Dr. J. Ford Hodge. The dead men are of a class which has been troublesome for some time. Some, it is said, had families in Europe, but had no relatives here. The dead are Frank Defatta, Charles Defatta, Jo Defatta, Sy Defferroch and John Cereno.

For several weeks a lot of goats be longing to Frank Defatta have been sleeping and running on the gallery of Dr. Hodge's office and residence The doctor on numerous occasions re ing Frank Defatta came to the doctor's office and said:

'You shoot my goat, now you better shoot me."

pass Joe Defatta's shop in going to them. About sundown Thursday evening the doctor and Mr. Kauffman started for supper. Mr. Kauffman, who was in the lead, says that as they got to Joe's store Charles Defatta was sitting on the steps and Joe was standing at the door. Kauffman spoke to them. but neither returned the greeting. As Dr. Hodge passed Charles jumped up

and said: "You shoot my goat," and struck the

Dr. Hodge attempted to repel the attack, but finding his assailant too much for him started to draw his pis-tol. Joe Defatta, at the door, fired both loads of the double barrel shot-gun at the doctor, striking him in the hands and abdomen. At the crack of the gun Frank Defatta, Sy Deferroch and John Cereno, who were in the neighborhood, started on a run to Joe's store with shotguns and long knives in their hands.

Court was in session and a large crowd of country people were in town. They joined the sheriff and his deputies in the chase and succeeded in arresting and disarming Frank Defatta, Sy Deferroch and John Cereno after a

hard struggle. The sheriff with his possee went to the Defatta home and captured Charles Defatta. Joe was found hidden under a chimney in an adjoining house. He was taken out and the sheriff started toward the jail with his two prisoners. When Court Square was reached a crowd of 250 citizens overpowered the sheriff and after a severe struggle took Joe and Charles to the slaughter pen and hung them to the gallows used for slaugtering beeves.

Joe did the shooting and said Charles did it. Charles said Joe fired the shots, which half a dozen people saw. Charles said Frank Defatta and Sy Deferroch were the cause of the trouble.

In the confusion a number of women who were in the crowd were thrown down and a little girl was struck by a policeman's club and se-verely bruised.


