



# MT. DESERT HORROR.

Score of Persons Drowned by the Breaking of a Gaug Plank.

A HUNDRED AND FIFTY PEOPLE

Precipitated Into the Water, and Many Sank Beneath the Waves While Clutching Each Other in a Death Grapple-All Were Excursionists.

Bar Harbor, Me., Aug. 7 .- A score of persons were killed yesterday by the collapse of a gangplank of the Mount Desert ferry. Seventeen were drowned and three died from the terrible experience of immergion in the water and injuries while struggling for

The Maine Central railroad ran ex-cursions to Bar Harbor from all sec-tions of its line in Maine, the sitrac-tion being the warships, which were expected yesterday. All the morning long trains packed

with excursionists were rushing to Bar Harbor. The train which le': Bangor

Finrbor. The train which is: Bangor at 8:25 consisted of 12 cars jammed with people. At Mount Desert ferry, the terminus of the line, the train is left for the boat, for an eight mile sail to Bar Harbor. From the wharf a slip, or gangplank, 40 feet long and 10 feet wide, led up to the boat. The elin was binned at the innor and the slip was hinged at the inner end, the outer end being supported by chains, by which it was raised or lowered to suit the tide. The wharf extends on both sides flush with the end of the wooden gangplank. Five timbers, four by twelve inches, set vertically ran the length of the plank, and these were crossed by two inch planking. It is said that there was no support for the

plank between the hinges at the outer

When the excursion train from Bangor arrived at the ferry there was a rush for the steamer Sappho. The first few passengers had crossed the gangplank safely, and it is estimated that 200 people were massed on the plank. Suddenly they fell, the plank giving away beneath them. The long timber supporting the plank broke in the middle. The hinges held up one end and the chain the other, while the broken ends of the plank dropped, and a struggling, screaming mass of humanity was plunged into the water 15 feet below the wharf. A few clung to the inclined sides of the plank, but at least 150 were struggling in the water. The piling of the wharf practically penned them in on three sides, and the boat lying at the wharf closed the outer end of the opening. Ropes and life preservers were thrown

to the crowd, but in the panic the peo-ple in the water clutched one another, many sank thus in groups in a death struggle. Many taken from the water were unconscious and were re-vived with difficulty. The freight house at the ferry was turned into a morgue, the bodies being taken there for identification as fast as recovered. By noon 17 had been recovered. Three other persona were taken on board the Sappho, and died on the way to Bar Harbor. WELL KNOWN SOCIETY LADY

They have been making money since then, too, and it is known that they have been laying in a big supply of arms and ammunition

for some time past. It has been common talk among the American prospec tors in the Yaqui valley that the In-dians were preparing for another outbreak, but as the braves had always shown a friendly spirit towards the Americans it was thought they would not molest them when they do go on the warpath. They are determined to recover all of their lost country, however, and will kill everybody they find within the limits of their old possessions," The dispatch also says that a num-
