Rennes, Aug. 21.-General Mercler, who was minister of war when Captain Dreyfus was condemned, and who in the present trial is the virtual prosecutor, was called upon yesterday afternoon by a press correspondent who invited him to make a statement of the position of the anti-Dreyfusards. Although unable to receive the correspondent in person, General Mercler sent his oldest son to convey the fol-lowing expressions of his views:

"General Mercier considers it use-less to attempt to convert foreign opinion regarding the Dreyfus question, in which, moreover, foreigners have no right to intervene. Foreign peoples have been misled by their press, which is violently Dreyfusard, for the very



He was arrested on Saturday by order of General Wilson and afterward released on General Brooke's orders. The arrest was made because it was supposed he was about to leave Cuba to engage in the revolution in Santo Domingo, After his release he remained

In an interview he said: "My misalon is perfectly peaceful. I am un-armed and am going home to answer to my country's call to take peaceful peacesulon of the presidency. It was no more lawful to arrest me than it would be to arrest Mr. McKinley when, after its election, he was going from Canton
