THE PEARY EXPEDITION

Ample Provisioned for the Coming Winter Season.

ACCIDENT TO LIEUTENANT PEARY Having His Foot Frostbitten, He Was Obliged to Have Several Toes Amputated—Will Be Ready to Take the Field Again in February.

Driggs, N. F., Sept. 11.—The Peary-Harmon expedition, which departed on Aug. 26, arrived here yesterday, reporting all well on board. Fifty will be followed in a week by the Peary Arctic club's steamer Diann, Captain S. W. Bartlett, also from Etah. The Diann were well at the time the vessel separated.

As soon as the young ice could bear a sledge, Lieutenant Peary made a careful reconnaissance of the coast line southwest of All Man bay and carefully defined the lands and water between that point and Cape Sabine. The coast line of Princess Marie bay and Buchanan strait, heretofore unknown, was accurately defined and Hayes sound was demonstrated to be a myth.

Lieutenant Peary found Fort Conger exactly as Greely left it. The building was standing from the last meal and all the other appointments had remained undisturbed for 16 years.

He also pushed a reconnaissance beyond Fort Conger to Cape Beechey, which practice by the same conditions of ice and sea as north of the former point. Subsequently he made a second trip to Fort Conger, and in all four parties from the Windward reached that point and returned without other accident than that to Lieutenant Peary himself as a result of the winter work.

THE EXPORTS FROM THE UNITED STATES TO Porto Rico for the seven months were \$2,359,221 in 1899, against \$599,110 in 1898.

THE EXPORTS FROM THE UNITED STATES TO THE PHILIPPINE ISLANDS FROM JAN. 1 TO JULY 31 WERE \$386,129 IN 1899, AGAINST \$65,726 IN 1898.
