# Modest Women TRANSVAAL WILL YIELD.

Latest Dispatches Do Not Portend Defiance of England.

THE BOER LEADERS CONFERRING.

The Decision of the Executive Will Doubtless Be Influenced by the Action of the Orange Free State-British Concessions Displease Natal.

London, Sept. 14.-A dispatch from Pretoria says: President Kruger and the executive council met here last evening to consider the reply to be made to the British secretary of state for the colonies, Mr. Chamberlain. They are still conferring by telegraph with the Orange Free State. The de-cision is anxiously awaited by crowds outside the executive building.

A communication has been received from the British government stating that although anxious for a prompt reply the imperial authorities do not desire to tie the Transvaal authorities down to 48 hours.

The imperial government, when in-timating that it did not desire to fix a time limit, pointed out that its chief desire was only for "reasonable promptness in order to put an end to the tension.

It is understood that President Kruger is awaiting the arrival from Bloemfontein of Mr. Fischer, of the Orange Free State executive council, before

drafting his reply.

The reply will possibly come before the volksrand this afternoon. The de-cision of the executive will undoubt-

edly be influenced by the action of the Orange Free State. government is still willing to attend the joint commission originally

The report as to a time limit of 48 hours arose from the fact that the AFTER USING. British diplomatic agent at Pretoria Conyngham Greene, in presenting Mr Chamberlain's dispatch expressed a hope that a reply would be given by the Transvani government by Thurs-

The Cape Times and the Cape Argus both consider the British note gener-ous and conciliatory, and all the papers, including the Krugerite organs, assume that the Transvaal will comply with the British demands.

It is believed that the Orange Free State volksrand will be summoned to consider the situation.

The Transvani war office denies any knowledge of the reported offer of 10,-000 Irish-Americans to fight against Great Britain.

Military developments continue and the work of preparation for emergencies goes on. Upon the arrival of the next batch of British troops the head-quarters staff of the Royal artillery will be transferred to Kimberly, whither a battery will proceed to protect the diamond mines.

The war instructions issued to rail-

way officials direct them to remain at their posts as long as possible. When the enemy selzes any section of the line the officials must go to the next unselzed point. They are forbidden to carry arms or to resist any regular

The Times regards Mr. Chamber-lain's dispatch as "clear, resolute and earnest, without being peremptory, not necessarily an ultimatum, but a pre lude to an ultimatum, should the Transvaal's reply prove unfavorable." This fairly represents the feeling of the London morning papers. Even The Daily Chronicle, which is virtually pro-Kruger in its sympathies, urges the Boers to accept "the imperial gov-ernment's reasonable demands, which threaten no ulterior danger to the independence of the Transvaal."

A dispatch from Pietermaritzburg capital of Natal, says that the outlanders' council expresses great dis-satisfaction with the British note, complaining that the imperial author-ities are willing to accept inadequate concession in order to avoid war.
