PROTEST FROM CHINA

SENSE pectant mother Objects to the Order Excluding Chinese From Philippines.

OPPOSES INTERNATIONAL LAW

General Otla' Order, Says the Chinese Protest, Is a Departure From the Announced Pury see of the President of the United States.

Washington, Sept. 19.—The imperial Chinese government, through its minister here, Mr. Wu Ting-Fang, has lodged with the state department an emphatic protest against the military order of General Otis excluding Chinese from the Philippines. Neither the state department nor the Chinese legation will give any information concerning the protest, but from entirely reliable quarters it is now learned that it insists that General Otis' action is contrary to international and in complete disregard of the friendly relations which have been so long maintained between the two countries. Minister Wu called at the state department last Friday, and it is be-

The matter was promptly brought to the attention of the president, as the protest was of such a character as to give the subject an international aspect, considerably beyond the purely military questions involved. It is said that China points out that she has wel-comed the recent advent of the United States into the affairs of the far east, and has hoped that this step would prove a further bond and would extend the relations between the two countries, particularly in their neigh-boring possessions. Furthermore, it is understood that among the specific points of protest submitted by the Chinese government is one to the effect that such an order is a departure from the announced purpose of the presi-dent of the United States to maintain the present status of affairs in the Philippines until congress had determined a permanent condition.

The military phases of the question have been referred to Secretary Root. Owing to his familiarity with inter-national law he probably will consider the subject broadly, both in its international as well as its military aspects. General Otis' order was issued some time ago, without direction contrary that the Chinese have ren-dered valuable military assistance.

General Otis' order excepts such Chi-ness as have previously lived in the Philippines, and who hold certificates showing this fact. It also excepts Chinese officials, travelers, etc., exmade for registering the Chinese in the Philippines, and their deportation to China in case of failure to register. As very few Chinese other than those now in the Philippines come within the exceptions, the effect of the decree is to make the exclusion practically absolute.

It is understood that the Chinese government regards the outcome of this protest with much apprehension. It is pointed out that the Chinese have been long established in the Philippines, and that a considerable branch of the industry of the islands is conducted by them, and that this com-plete termination of a long established communication between China and the Philippines injures these people both personally and materially.
The Chinese protest is said to be couched in most dignified and courte-ous terms, but to be so pointed that





For Plotting to Overthrow the Government of France.

ADJOURNMENT FOR SOME WEEKS.

The French Senate, Sitting as a High Court, Will Allow the Prisoners to Be Represented by Counsel During the Parliamentary Hearing.

Fallleres entered was again opened wide, and three tall figures, in long scarlet robes, appeared on the threshold and with stately mien marched of the platform took up their places or first was M. Bernard, the procurator general, who was a handsome figure in his scarlet robe trimmed with a broad strip of ermine. M. Bernard immediately began to read the indict-ment in a monotonous voice.

The indictment commenced by recit-ing the facts of the arrest of MM. Deroulede and Marcel Hubert, and said the inquiry has showed the existence of a conspiracy to change the form of government, to which the disorders of last February, it was added, were due, and in which MM. Deroulede, Marcel Habert and some members of the League of Patriots, M. Guerin and some members of the Anti-Semite League, M. Du Buc and some members of the Anti-Semite youth, M. Baffett, Godefrey and Chevally and mem-bers of the Royalist party were inculpated. All the societies mentioned since 1898, it was pointed out, had abandoned electoral action for revolu-tionary action, and the League of Patriots openly pursued the object of overthrowing the constitutional government, Mal. Deroulede and Marcel Habert seeking to attain their end by the union of rioters and troops in the streets.

M. Du Buc, it was further charged, te the link between the anti-Semite and Patriotic leagues.

The indictment then gave a few particulars of the provincial organization. Referring to the Royalist league, it said it was worthy of attention, be cause, though the idea of a monarchic restoration appeared inconceivable, it had played a preponderant role in the recent events, its leader being the Duke of Orleans himself and its man-agers his accredited representatives. All the leagues, it was asserted, seek to change the form of government by street risings.

A letter from the Duke of Orleans

to his representative, M. The mention of this figure evoked laughter from the senators and others present.

After a number of incidents in which strest rioting was fomented by the con spirators, the indictment proceeded with a recapitulation of the royalist manoeuvers, and declared the royalists led and paid a mob to insult President Loubet on the day of his election. The culminatory point of the royalist conspiracy was reached Feb. 23, when M. Deroulede made his notorious attempt on the Place de la Nation to induce a brigade of infantry to march on the Elysee palace. Everything, it seems, was prepared to carry out the royalist plan that day, but M. Derou-

lede's failure spoiled all, and the Duke of Orleans, who was awaiting at Brussels the signal to come to Paris, re-ceived instead a tolegram from M. Buffet, saying: "Useless to come." Continuing, the indictment then ex-plained that the conspiracy was not abandoned with the failure of Feb. 23, but that the machinations continued in but that the machinations continued in secret and public meetings were con-

tinually held.

The indictments evoked frequent out bursts of derisive laughter and ironical comment at the expense of the royal ists, especially on the reading of the various telegrams exchanged and the failure of the plots.

At the conclusion of the reading of the indictment M. Bernard and his colleagues left the senate, and M. Falseres ordered the senators to sit behind closed doors.

On the resumption of the public sitting M. Fallieres announced that the senate had decided, by a vote of 234 against 32, to allow prisoners to be represented by counsel during the preliminary inquiry, but that the question of the competency of the senate to sit as a high court to try the charges had been adjourned until after the con-clusion of the preliminary inquiry This is tantamount to an adjournment of the high court for several weeks at


