## SUBMARINE FIGHTER

Makes a Remarkably Good Showing in a Practice Run.

CONSIDERED PERFECTLY SAFE.

W. R. Eckert, an Expert Engineer, Declares His Conviction That There Is No Trouble For the Boat to Do All That is Claimed For It.

Greenpert, N. Y., Sept. 23.-The submarine torpedo boat made a remarkably good showing during the practice run yesterday. The trials vere made over the course in Little Peccale bay, which will be used for the government tests to be held later. The vessel was recently overhauled, and during the run of yesterday showed a considerable increase of speed. The new div-ing apparatus for operating the steer-ing engines worked successfully, the boat getting under water and completely out of sight in quick time. Besides diving, running on the surface and under water for a length of time, torpedo practice was indulged in. The Whitehead torpedo was used, similar in design to those used on the smaller vessels of the United States navy. Sufficient air was stored in the air chamber of the torpedo to give it a radius of action of about 500 yards. The trial was in sending the boat over a mile course submerged, at the end of which it came to the surface and the torpedo discharged from the tube which is about five feet below the surface of the water.

The run under the water was made

in about 10 minutes. The torpedo was successfully discharged from the tube, but owing to what is thought to have been a disarrangement of some of the mechanism the torpedo, instead of taking a straight course, took a down-ward turn and the volume of muddy water sent up showed that it struck the bottom 50 feet from the bow of the

W. R. Eckert, consulting engineer for the Standard Electric company, of California, said when asked about the boat and its performance:

"I am very much pleased with the exhibition and am convinced there is no trouble for the boat to do all that is claimed for it. I feel safer in the Holland boat when under water than in the engine or fire rooms of any of the fast torpedo boats. I consider her absolutely safe."

Convicted of Embezziement.

Media, Pa., Sept. 23.—John L. Kitts of this place, formerly receiving teller in the Delaware County National bank, of Chester, was convicted in the county court here yesterday of embez-zlement. He was appointed under his father's will as trustee for his sister and was directed to pay her an income of \$4,094. He complied with the con-tents of the will until June, 1896, when he informed his sister that he could not keep up the payments. A trust company was then appointed trustee, but Kitts had none of the estate left to turn over to the company, and he was arrested. His defense was that he invested the money in property which subsequently depreciated; but he invested the money in his name, and not as trustee. He will be sentenced on Monday.

Shamrock Escapes Serious Accident New York, Sept. 23.-Good judgment on the part of those in charge of the yacht Shamrock yesterday saved her from what might have been a most serious accident. After sailing in a strong breeze over about five miles of the course off the New Jersey coast her crew found that the boystay was stretching and in danger of carrying away, so Designer Fife ordered the sail taken off her and she was towed to her moorings in the Horseshoe.



# VETS WILL NOT MARCH

In the Land Parade in New York's Dewey Reception.

COMMITTEE SUSTAINS GEN. ROE.

Governor Hooseveit. Who Had Ordered the Grand Army Men Placed in the Front, Withdraws His Order on Learning of His Lack of Authority.

New York, Sept. 23.-At yesterday's meeting of the plan and scope com-mittee of the Dewey celebration Gen-eral Ros, himself a member of the G. A. R., made a long statement giving his reasons for refusing to permit the Grand Army of the Republic to head the land parade. General Roe says he has taken the position from the be-ginning that the day was emphatically a navy day, and that Admiral Dewey and the sailors of the Olympia should be in the lead, with nothing whatever to detract. The committee unanimously decided to approve the action of General Roe.

General A. D. Shaw, commander-in-chief of the G. A. R., and Commander Kay, of the state department, publish statements reiterating their intention not to parade in the rear, and as Governor Roosevelt has no authority in the matter it is settled that the vet erans of the civil war will not partic

ipate.
General Roe received a telegram from Governor Roosevelt yesterday morning directing him to give the G. A. R. the choice of any place in the parade. Immediately on receiving the telegram General Roe had a conference with Mayor Van Wyck, and then Chairman Guggenheimer, of the plan and scope committee, which has charge of the parade, was notified of the gov ernor's dispatch. Mr. Guggenheimer pointed out that his committee alone had the right to assign places in the

Last night Governor Roosevelt, in an Interview in Utica, said have telegraphed General Ros that if the matter is one only for the city authorities, and in which I have no power, then of course I withdraw my former telegram. I had under-stood that General Roe was acting as major general of the National Guard in the management of the parade, and In that event I, of course, had the power to direct that the veterans be given the right of the line, and ac-cordingly did it. If, however, as appears to be the case, it is a matter purely for the city officials, I, of course, have nothing to say, and no advice to


