THE TRANSVAL PUEZZER

Premier Salisbury Insists that He Is For Peace. YET WAR PREPARATIONS GO ON. In the Event of War the Transval Will Have Nine Generals in Command of Columns—A Plan of Campaign With the Orange Free State.

London, Oct. 3.—No confirmation is obtainable from any source of the report contained in a dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph company that the Boers have captured Dundee. No exceptional activity was shown at the government offices yesterday.

Many members of parliament are returning to town in anticipation of an early summoning of the houses of parliament. It is the general impression that, although some speakers may express disapproval of the government policy, few will go to the extreme of voting against the war.

A letter from an outlander received in Birmingham was published yesterday. It reflects the general feeling of the British residents in Johannesburg that they must be in a awful funk.

Reports from various arsenals and garrisons in Great Britain testify to the active continuance of military preparations. The reserves have received preliminary notice to be prepared, and several regiments have been notified to hold themselves in readiness for active service.

The rumor that fighting had already commenced seemed to have originated at the Woolwich arsenal. Matters are at a standstill, and practically no dispatches from South Africa have been received this morning.

The Morning Post again complains editorially that, although the government has not put the plan in the July, October has arrived without visible progress having been made. The paper asks what they are waiting for, and expresses the opinion that "the expectant attitude maintained is hardly consonant with the high sounding words that have been uttered."

It is understood that the colonial office received an important dispatch from Sir Alfred Milner, British high commissioner for South Africa, yesterday, the contents of which, however, have not been made public.

The Chronicle, which has lately been admitting the policy of sending an imperial commissioner—suggesting for the post the Marquis of Dufferin and Ava—to meet President Kruger and try to arrange matters, today argues that the ministers now see the mischief which Mr. Chamberlain has brought about by sending the Duke of Devonshire to the Cape.

A special dispatch from Pretoria says that General Jan Kock will command the Boer forces on the Natal border. Commandant Cronje on the southern border, and General Schalkburg on the eastern frontier, while General Malan will be in command at Rustenburg. Altogether there will be nine generals in command of columns.

A rigorous censorship is maintained over all press telegrams. President Kruger addressed the troops which started for the Natal border on Saturday, appealing to their patriotism and wishing them goodspeed. Fighting is expected by tomorrow.

A rumor, which, however, lacks confirmation, is current at the clubs that the Duke of Connaught will accompany Sir General Redvers Buller to Africa as imperial commissioner to confer with President Kruger and President Steyn.

Women Fought the Flames. Springfield, Mo., Oct. 3.—The little town of Stratford, ten miles east of here, has been practically destroyed by fire. Nearly all the male population was in Springfield attending a meeting of the Woodmen, and the women had to fight the fire almost alone. At times every building in the city was in flames. Women saved several residences by the use of wet blankets.

"DISCIPLINE" MAY CAUSE DEATH. Sadie Weisman's Brutal Treatment at New Jersey Industrial School. Paterson, N. J., Oct. 3.—Sadie Weisman, the young girl of this city who was an inmate of the State Industrial School for Girls, at Trenton, and who it is alleged, was ill-treated there, is dying at Paterson. President Bishop of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, has ordered that her ante-mortem statement be taken. She suffers from a trouble in her throat, and is unable to speak, and also some troubles of the stomach, where she says she was injured by an attendant at the school putting his knee on her during a punishment.
