## GEN. FUNSTON'S RETURN

Kansas Here and His Followers Welcomed at San Francisco.

GENERAL RIDICULES A REPORT.

Declares the Statement That He Is an Anti-Expansionist Not Worthy of Sectous Consideration - Everything For Best Being Done in Philippines.

San Francisco, Oct. 12.—The Twen-tieth Kansas regiment and the 400 discharged soldiers who arrived here on Tuesday night on the transport Tartar were landed yesterday. The march to the Presidio reservation was a continuous ovation. The streets were thronged with excited people, all anxlous to honor the returned heroes. Cheers upon cheers passed up and down the lines of people. Cannon were fired at intervals, bells clanged and

whistles and steam calliones added their respective noises to the occasion. General Funston marched with Governor Stanley, of Kansas, and escort. The throngs surged around General Funston, and he had great difficulty in making progress. Rounds of cheers greeted him, but his only acknowledg-

ment was a military salute and an occasional doffing of his cap. The crowds simply would not let the soldiers pass in peace. Breaks occurred every few minutes. Relatives and friends broke into the ranks and marched with the soldiers, some smiling and laughing and others

The regimental colors, little the worse for wear in spite of the arduous campaign through which they had passed, called forth a tremendous burst of applause whenever they were sight-Taking it all in all, the soldiers looked to be in fair health, but of course there were some who showed effects of the severe campaign. Bringing up the rear of the regiment were the hospital wagons, not very heavily laden with sick.

The parade was reviewed on Vanness avenue by General Shafter, Gov-ernor Stanley and Governor Rogers, of Washington, and their staffs. General Funston in an interview

"I have only this to say of the campaign in the Philippines, everything is being done that could be to carry the war to an early and successful conclusion. The report that I am anti-expansion is ridiculous and not worthy of serious consideration. I never in-timated such a thing and have been wrongly quoted in the matter.

The people must stop to consider when they are passing judgments that there are countless conditions to be constantly combatted and overcome sefore headway can be made. I fear that the exact difficulties to the sit-uation are not fully understood.

"Some mistakes have been made, but the campaign has been conducted in a most able and conscientious manner and every man has done his best. No always easy to look back and comment upon what has been done, even though that might have been accomplished

LOYAL CANADIANS.

They Will Ask to Bear All Expense of

Furnishing Troops.
Toronto, Oct. 12.—The Globe, the official monthpiece of the Dominion government, in its Ottawa correspond ence, states that the imperial govern ment has cabled the Dominion authorities asking how many men Canad can furnish for service in South Af rica at once. A reply has been sen stating that 1,000 men, the pick of th Canadian troops, can be put on boar a transport within ten days or two weeks. It is said that a transport has already been engaged to sail from Montreal on the 23d or 24th inst. A contract was given Tuesday to a big clothing firm in Hamilton, Ont., by the government for 1,000 uniforms. Cavalry, infantry and mounted infantry are to be sent forward.

The greatest enthusiasm is mani-fested throughout Canada, and a secand continuent of 1,000 men will undoubtedly be affered in a few weeks The imperial government states that Canada will be asked to land the troops at Natal or Delagon buy, and that all expenses are to be paid by the home government.
