

HEROIC WATCHMAN MET DEATH.

But For the Bravery of Samuel Jayne the Loss of Life Would Have Seen More Appailing-Charges of Cowardlee Against the Crew Not Sustained.

New York, Oct. 16 .- Nine persons lost their lives and as many more were injured by the burning, early Saturday morning, of the Bridgeport line steamat the Nutmeg State, off Sands

Point Long Island sound. The dead are: Charles Anderson, watchman on the boat; Patrick Cof-fey, mate; John Connors, member of crow; Bernard Hendry, oller; Samuel Jayne, Bridgeport, Conn., baggage master: Thomas Murphy, member of crew: Nils Nilson, member of crew; unknown woman, passenger; unknown man, passenger.

There was a panle aboard the Nutmeg State when the cry of fire aroused engers from their sleep. The vesel was burning flercely amidships. After passengers and crew had left the burning vessel she was sent at full eed toward the beach, where she lies, a total wreck.


