A QUADRUPLE MURDERER.

Terrible Crime of an Insane Farmer

In Minnesota.

Redwood Falls, Sinn, Oct. 19.—
Frank E. Babcock, a farmer, residing near this city, mardered his wife and three sons on his farm yeared. The murder was committed in a first of inmurder was committed in a fit of insanity.
