RIOTOUS NEGRO SOLDIERS.

Brutally Beat a Laredo Pottceman and Patally Wound a Utilzen.
Laredo, Tex., Oct. 20.—Friction between the Laredo police and the negro roldiers at Fort McIntosh resulted in a street riot Wednesday night. Policeman William Stoner, about midnight, arrested a soldier for some oftary authorities. The report of the arrest infuriated the soldiers, who battered down the door of the ord-nance room, secured their arms and started on a rampage through the west-ern part of the city, 50 strong. Finding Policeman Stoner, they covered him with their rifles, disarming him and then clubbed and stamped him Then they rained a regular fusillade down the several streets, and bullets whistled all over the city. Only one casualty from the shooting has been reported, that of C. Nuncio, who was

shot while walking along Lincoln street and fatally wounded. Lieutenant J. M. Campbell, in com-mand at the fort, who was attending an entertainment in the city, hastened to the barracks, threw out the guards and had the roll called, but all the sol-diers had reached there ahead of him. The arms had also been returned to the armory, but showed evidence of recent use. The lieutenant has issued orders confining the garrison to the reservation for 30 days.

Lieutenant Campbell was a corporal in the Seventy-first New York volunteers and for bravery shown at San Juan hill was appointed to a second lieutenancy in the regular army. The company which did the rioting dis-tinguished itself at El Caney.

One thousand acres of land has been secured, with a frontage of 4,500 feet on the river. The works will include a 600 tons blast furnace, ten 50 tons open hearth steel furnaces, a plate mill and a bar mill.


