

## A MILITARY PAGEANT

Escorted General Henry's Body Through New York Streets.

EODY TAKEN TO WASHINGTON.

Dead in Arlington Cemetery-"The Rule in Porto Rico," From the Pen

most impressive military funeral parade since the death of General William T. Sherman took place yesterday when the body of General Guy V. Henry was removed from his residence to the Pennsylvania railroad train that conveyed it to Washington, where the interment will be made in Arlington

The services at the residence were conducted by the Rev. John Huske, of St. Thomas' Protestant Episcopai church, and consisted of simple prayers, lasting not more than ten minutes The coffin was partially covered with a silk American flag. Numerous floral Billousness, constipation, pleces were on the mantels and a few on the foot of the coffin. The immediate family, relatives and the most intimate friends were present at the

house service.

The honorary pallbearers were General A. S. Webb, Major Azel Ames and Major Francis H. Mills, of the Loyal Legion; Colonel Daniel Appleton, De Albert Shaw, William R. Corwin, Henry Hamilton Lewis and Gilbert K. Harroun. The military pallbearers were Colonels John S. Rodgers, J. W. Clous, Peter D. Vroom and Tully McCrea, Lieutenant Colonels Carl A. Woodruff and John P. Myrick, Major J. B. Burbank and Captain B. K. Rob erts. Lieutenant T. B. Mott, of the Sevenih artillery, was present as of-ficially representing the United States government, and went to Washington with the body.

While the services were being conducted in the house three national guard regiments, the Seventh, Sixtyninth and Seventy-first, marched down Madison avenue and took positions in readiness for the parade. The Second battery, Captain Wilson commanding, lay on Thirty-first street, and a caisson was brought up in front of the door ready for the coffin. Upon the calseon was draped a large American flag, and eight horses were attached, each near horse having a rider.

In spite of the rain at the time of the services a large crowd collected, but it was kept in check by a detachment of mounted and foot police. It had been the intention of Captain Wilson to have the same calsson that was used at the funeral of General Sherman, but it was found that that calsson was in the United States arsenal, and was kept as a memento. One of the battery caissons was therefore used, and that will be kept in a similar way, a large silver plate being placed upon it,

marking the occurrence.

After the services in the house were finished the coffin was carried out to the caisson by eight artillery sergeants from the surrounding military posts and who acted as body bearers during the services. The caisson was then driven up Madison avenue as far as Thirty-third street and the carriages with the family and honorary pall-bearers followed. The carriages then turned and proceeded down the ave-nue, immediately following the Sev-enth regiment, and followed by the Sixty-ninth and Seventy-first regiments. As the procession started the Seventh regiment band, augmented to 75 pieces, started Chopin's funeral march, which was played unceasingly
