

At Charleston a Small Frame Dwelling Was Wreeked and One Child Killed-Many Cottages Wreeked on North Carolina's Coast.

Wilmington, N. C., Nov. L -- Authori-tative reports from Weightwille and Corolinn Peach may that the storm, which reached the height of its fury at 4 o'clock yesterday morning, has wrought great havon to property at those poluts. No loss of life is re-

ported At Wrightsville there are sixty odd cottages, and of this number fifteen are a total loss and the others hadly damaged. Loss is estimated at from \$20,000 to \$25,000.

The treatle of the Wilmington Sea Coast grinoad and track, aggregating in extent about three miles, are wrecked and the damage is conservatively estimated at from \$40,000 to \$50,000. At Wrightsville Sound, on the main line, about one mile this side of the beach, considerable damage was also done, and this is estimated at several thousand. Boers After Henvy Losses, London, Nov. L .- An official report

received from General White yester-day has caused the greatest consternation. The report declares that in the battle of Ladysmith the Royal brish Fusiliers, the Gloucestershire regiment and No. 10 mountain battery were cut off by the Boors in the hills, lost heav lly and were forced to capitulate, and that the British were forced to fall back all along the battlefield line be-fore the crushing attack. He adds: "I formed a p'an, in the carrying out of which the disaster occurred, and I am along responsible for the plan. There is no blame whatever to the

troops, as the position was untenable.' No dispatch, except the official tels grams of General Sir George Stewart White, has thus far been permitted to mention the disaster, and no telegram from Ladysmith has been received in London since the advices from the British commander. This gives rise to a bellot that communication has already been cut, in which event some time most slapse before details re-garding British losses are received. If the war office officials have received information on this point they have refrained from publishing it. General White's estimate that the British losses were about 90 is evidently quite separate from the probable losses in killed and wounded among the cap tured battallons.

In

Sir George White's honest admis-sion of full responsibility and the terms of his dispatch are regarded in some circles as virtually placing his case in the hands of the home authorities, and it is even rumored that the war office has already decided to supersede him. The report, however, is dis-credited in well informed quarters.

In Gloucestershire and the north of Ireland, where the captured regiments were recruited the blackest gloom pre-valls, families awaiting with beating hearts the names of the killed and wounded, which are fully expected to reach a high figure. Many homes ar already in mourning in consequence of losses sustained by these regiments in previous engagements.
