General Funston Will Not Prosecute Archbishop Ireland. ARCHBISHOP MADE NO CHARGES.

He Merely Advised That the Kansas Rero Should Dony Statements Printed in a Catholic Newspaper of San

General Funston says that he not only refrained from desecrating houses of worship in Manila, but that while colonel of the Kansas regiment issued posive-order prohibiting the looting or mutilation of church buildings. He supplemented this with verbal in-structions to his company commanders to see that the order was rigidly enforced.

A dispatch from Topeka says: C. S. Gleed, senior member of the law firm of Gleed, Ware & Gleed, stated that his firm had received absolutely no intimation of any purpose to begin any legal proceedings against Arch-bishop Ireland. He had simply recelved a personal telegram from General Funston requesting him to ascer tain if Archbishop Ireland had been correctly quoted.



British Officials Not Inclined to Judge the Defented Commander Harshly. Not a War of Conquest-British Cas-

ualities Over Two Thousand Thus Far

London, Nov. 2.-The breakdown of the Delagoa cable route, combined with the monopolization of the avail-able telegraph lines by the government and British staff officers, is responsible for the fact that nothing further has arrived from South Africa. The government has received dispatches recti-fying the casualty lists. Up to midnight nothing had been received concerning X@aday's casual-

describing Monday's fight, says: A couple of squadrons of hussars had a narrow escape from disaster early in the day. They found themselves suddenly confronted, within easy range, by an overwhelmingly force of Boers, who seemed to spring from the bowels of the earth. The hussars were splen-didly handled, and were extricated with only one man wounded. The queen is credited with express

ing sincere pity for Sir George White, and the officials are in no wise inellned to judge him harshiy. So far es the public is concerned, however, while gratification is felt at the man-ner in which the isolated battalions surrendered, there is still severe criticism for General White and Lieuten-ant Colonel Carelton for allowing the column to get out of touch, for the absence of proper scouting and for not retiring when the ammunition was lost. In favor of Lieutenant Colonel Carelton, the explanation is hazarded that he believed it was imperative to the success of General White's opera-tions that he should hold the position

at Nicholsons Nek. A special dispatch from Pietermar-itzburg, Natal, dated Tuesday morning, says: Stragglers from the Glou-cestershire reg'ment are arriving at Ladysmith. A number of mules, with a portion of the mountain battery, are iso coming in.

The Morning Post comments severely upon the British contempt for the enemy, as shown by the belief that the large Boer force at Acton Homes could be held in check by Carelton's small column. It points out that even if the British there had been supplied with ammunition they could have held out only a few hours longer, inas-much as they were in the most complete sense detached, and because nobody apparently at Ladysmith had any idea of their distress or took any mensures to rescue them. "The col-RAILROAD umn was sacrificed," says The Morn-ing Post, "because it was sent into action gagged and blindfolded. It had neither scout nor patrol. Twelve hun-dred men were thrown away for lack of cavalry which would not have been missed from another part of the field." The Standard comments in similar terms upon "the fact that General White made no effort to extricate the






