THE PHILIPPINES

As Viewed by President McKinley's Special Commissioners.

THE PEOPLE INTELLIGENT, But as Yet They Are Incapable of Self Government.

THE DEALINGS WITH AGUINALDO.

At No Time Was the Insurgent Leader Promised the Aid of This Government in Establishing the Independence of the Islands.

Washington, Nov. 3.—The Philippine commission yesterday submitted to the president the preliminary report which it has prepared.

Turning to the history of the islands the commission attaches little importance to the divers rebellions which had preceded that of 1896.

The war begun in 1896 was terminated by the treaty of Blue-Na-Roton. The Filipinos were numerous, but possessed only about 500 small arms.

The report then tells how General Augustine came to Manila as governor general at the outbreak of the war between Spain and the United States.

Then follows Admiral Dewey's communications with E. Spencer Pratt, our consul general at Singapore, previous to the fall of Manila.

Upon the arrival of the squadron at Manila it was found that there was no insurrection to speak of, and it was accordingly decided to allow Aguinaldo to come to Cavite on board the Marcelline.

The commission's report then rapidly sketches events now historical. It tells in substance how the Filipinos attacked the Spanish and how General Anderson arrived, and Aguinaldo, at his request, returned from Cavite to Bacoor.

"Now for the first time arose the idea of national independence, Aguinaldo issued a proclamation, in which he took the responsibility of promising it to his people on behalf of the American government.

The report states that Aguinaldo wished to attack the Americans when they landed at Manila, but was deterred by lack of arms and ammunition.

A brief chapter then tells of the lack of success attending the effort made at this time by General Merritt, through a commission, to arrive at a mutual understanding with Aguinaldo as to his intentions.

The report concludes: "Our control means to the inhabitants of the islands the war is unavoidable.

"After the landing of our troops Aguinaldo made up his mind that it would be necessary to fight the Americans, and after the making of the treaty of peace at Paris this determination was strengthened.

Cuban Claims For War Losses. Washington, Nov. 3.—Professor A. V. Quosada has filed with the state department a claim for loss of property in Cuba during the war with Spain.

The uprising was viewed at first with indifference and later with fear. Throughout the insurrection at large there was treachery at those points to which armed legions had been sent.

As to the state of affairs when the commission left, it reports: "Before the commission left the Philippines the inhabitants had returned to their ruined villages.

The Municipality Governments. A chapter follows on the establishment of municipal governments, saying that with a single exception the officials elected proved worthy.

Special attention is given to the insurrection in Luzon, where the anti-American feeling had been strongest, public sentiment had greatly changed.

The fall failure of this attempt to establish an independent native government in Negros, conducted as it was under the most favorable circumstances, makes it apparent that here, as well as in the less favored provinces, a large amount of American control is at present absolutely essential to a successful administration of public affairs.

The efforts at negotiation with Aguinaldo and his various commissions are set forth in detail. The commission adds that nothing came of negotiations, as Aguinaldo's emissaries general at this point, and he came again, for information.

The commission believes to rate them high, but excepting in a limited number of persons whose capacities have not been tested by education or experience.

Incapable of Self Government. The report shows that this inability for self government is due to the old Spanish regime, which gave the Filipinos little or no part in governing themselves.
