OUR COUNTRY: First, Last and Forever.

COUNSEL for Ingham and Newitt, who were recently convicted in a United States court of conspiring with counterfeiters and bribing United States detectives, are making desperate efforts to save the convicted men.

The Results.

There is abundant cause for rejoicing over the result of the elections in all parts of the country on Tuesday. Not quite everything that was expected was achieved, but more than enough to demonstrate that the nation stands by the McKinley administration.

Pennsylvania's verdict is more emphatic than could reasonably have been hoped for under existing conditions in the Republican party in many counties. The Republicanism of the state will be measured by the vote cast for Judge J. Hay Brown, who had the hearty support of all classes of his party.

Ohio is undoubtedly carried by a substantial majority for the entire Republican ticket. Kentucky has for the second time elected a Republican governor, a result due to a bitter fight among the Democrats. New York comes up with a Republican legislature, and so does New Jersey. Mr. Bryan has succeeded in holding Nebraska, electing the fusion ticket by a comparatively small majority. Maryland has been regained by the Democrats, a result due more to in-excessable factionalism among the Republicans than to opposition to the policy of the administration.

Taking the result as a whole throughout the country, there is no evidence of discontent with Republicanism. The party is left in splendid condition to enter upon the great national contest next year with William McKinley as the standard bearer.

The result in the county, while replete with surprises, gives the Republicans a victory. The result at this writing shows that we have captured a majority of the offices, and the most desirable from a political standpoint. In view of the blunders made at the nominating convention, and the open hostility of some of the Republican "leaders" to a portion of the ticket, it is safe to assume that Shenandoah county can be relied upon, under favorable circumstances, to return a Republican majority. At any rate, the Republicans have much cause for congratulation over the result in this county on Tuesday.

REPUBLICAN NEW JERSEY.

The Latest Returns Show Only Three Democratic Counties. Trenton, Nov. 9.—Taking the highest candidate for the county office on each ticket in all the counties, the Republican plurality in New Jersey is well above 20,000.

Table showing election results by county: Atlantic, Bergen, Burlington, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Essex, Gloucester, Hudson, Hudson, Middlesex, Monmouth, Morris, Ocean, Passaic, Salem, Somerset, Union, Warren.

In addition to members of the legislature 17 sheriffs, 18 county clerks, 4 surrogate and 1 register were elected.

Pastorists Elect Congressman. Lincoln, Neb., Nov. 9.—Complete county returns coming in do not materially change the early estimates of the results of Tuesday's election. The fusionists carry the state by 12,000, where the early estimates gave the Republican nominee 157 majority.

Acting Prosecutor of Camden.

Trenton, Nov. 9.—Justice Garrison, of the supreme court, yesterday appointed as acting prosecutor of Camden county, to serve until Governor Voorles makes an appointment.

Drunk Negro's Shot Proved Fatal.

Baltimore, Nov. 9.—Oscar Dietz, the 12-year-old boy who was shot by one of a crowd of 50 hoodlum negroes Tuesday evening, died at the city hospital last night. It is said he indicated to the police the negro who fired the shot that caused his death.

Trains Collide, Sixteen Injured.

Kokomo, Ind., Nov. 9.—A Clover Leaf passenger and freight collided near here last night, damaging both trains and seriously wounding 16 people. The injured were brought to this city in ambulances and cared for. The passenger train was released at 5 o'clock from the siding here and the wreck occurred three minutes later on a curve. The engines are badly damaged.

Andrade at San Juan de Porto Rico.

Ponce, Porto Rico, Nov. 9.—It is now known that General Andrade, the defender of the city, has arrived at San Juan de Porto Rico on board the steamer St. Simon. He is quoted as having said in an interview that he was still president of Venezuela, and that he would soon return to that country.

ENGLAND OUT OF SAMOA

The Islands Now Belong to the United States and Germany.

SENATE MUST APPROVE PLAN.

Germany Takes the Islands of Upolu, Savali and Adjacent Islands, While Our Government Secures Tutuila and Subsidiary Islands.

Berlin, Nov. 8.—It was officially announced yesterday that an agreement, subject to the approval of the United States, had been arrived at between Great Britain and Germany by virtue of which the Samoa act is repealed and the islands of Upolu, Savali and the small adjacent islands fall to Germany as free property, and the islands of Tutuila and the subsidiary islands go to the United States.

Consular representatives of the two powers in Samoa and the Tonga Islands are to be withdrawn for the present, and German subjects are to have the same rights as British subjects in regard to the free and unimpeded enlistment of native laborers in the whole of the Solomon group in possession of Great Britain, including Choiseul and San Isabel.

Manila, Nov. 9.—General MacArthur has occupied Malabacat. His entire line, including the Twelfth, Seventeenth and Ninth infantry and part of the Fourth cavalry, is extended three miles in from Angeles, in a good tactical position.

Raleigh, Nov. 9.—News reached here yesterday that the safe in the office of Sheriff Hughes, at Hillsboro, N. C., was cracked Tuesday night. The robbers got \$5,000 in cash. No clew.
