NEW YORK LEGISLATURE.

Republicans Gain Twelve Sents in the

General Assembly. . New York, Nov. 3.-Returns receivd from up the state increase the Republican assembly membership to 23, against 57 Democrats, a Republican gain of 12.

In New York county the largest In New Fors county the targest Tammany plurality was that of the candidate for surrogate, Abner C. Thomas, 55,670. He was formerly a Henry George leader. Ex-Justice Jo-seph F. Daly, fusion candiate for supreme judge, who was expected to get many Democratic votes, did not head the pall of his ticket. The independent labor vote, as indicated by the vote for John S. Crosby for supreme judge was 5,700, or 3,000 less than the socialist vote. The Tammany pluralities In the several countles are about normal, the gains of assemblymen in this city being due largely to combinations with Citizens' Union and labor men against Republican candidates. Richard Croker today again express-

ed his regret that the Democrats up the state "had no organization," and, although he did not say so, it is in-ferred that Tammany hopes to organize the whole state for the campaign of 1900. Mr. Croker pointed to Ne-braska as an illustration of what energetic work will do, and declared that the Democrats can carry New York state in 1900.

Senator Platt and Assemblyman Mazet yesterday denied interviews in which they were credited with declaring that Assemblyman Stewart's seat would aurely be contested. They said that a contest would be made only in case convincing proof of fraud was discovered.

Philadelphia, Nov. 9.-Complete re-turns from 60 of the 67 counties in the state, and including Philadelphia, and with carefully revised estimates from the 7 missing countles, show a plural-ity of 109,465 for Barnett, Republican, for state treasury over Creasy, Demo-crat. The plurality for Brown, Republican, for supreme court judge will ex-ceed that of Barneit by probably 30,000. ### THE FUTURE OF CUBA. General Fitzbugh Lee Discusses the

Question of independence. New York, Nov. 5.— The Future of Cuba" is a paper by Major General Fitzhugh Lee, which appears in The Independent. He says:

Independent. He suys: "When will the United States evac-uate Caha? That is a question I am yery frequently asked, and I suppose it is natural for people to suppose that from my peculiar facilities for obser-vation in the island I might have some provided as at basis some authors. knowledge, or at least some opinion about it. Nevertheless, I have no such knowledge and no such opinion. There are many difficulties in the way of withdrawal, and whether or not we have in the last six months made progrees toward the end I am unable to "Yet I can say that during the last

six months crime has decremed and peace and prosperity are sproading or reviving in a great measure. This, however, secure attributable to the presence of the United States troops, whom the chief property holders and conservative business men insist must stay. The Cubans themselves seem to

he very much divided in opinion as to what ought to be done. "When the taking of the census has been finished the experiment of free

government by Cubana Cubana will, I believe, he tried. If it is found that the Cubans can organize and maintain a government in their island that will protect life and property, undoubtedly we shall withdraw and allow them to

go their way along the path of inde-pendence, accompanied by nothing more embarranaing than our very beat wishes."


