Meeting of the National Judiciary, Jr. O. U. A. M., at Philadelphia Nov. 15.
The National Judiciary of the Jr. O. U. A. M. will meet in Philadelphia on Wednesday, November 15, for the purpose of trying the State Council of Pennsylvania upon the charges preferred against it by National Councilor Belmer and upon which he suspended the State charter during the recent session of the State body at Scranton.
