WHOLESALE MURDERER CAPTURED. Hummel Dantes Guilt, But There is Strong Evidence Against Him. Williamsport, Pa., Nov. 25.—Further investigation into the quadruple murder near Montgomery reveals one of the most atrocious crimes on record, and fixes the guilt beyond doubt on William Hummel, husband and stepfather of the victims. Hummel was arrested yesterday at the home of Farmer John Russell, near Allenwood, and was lodged in jail in this city. He made a denial when taken into custody.

A NEW VETERANS' ORGANIZATION. All Who Served Against the Spaniards and Filipinos Eligible. Washington, Nov. 25.—A split has occurred in the organization of the Spanish War Veterans and a rival body was formed yesterday, to be known as the Spanish-American War Veterans. Yesterday's meeting was held in response to an urgent call of Adjutant General Liller, who gives as reasons for the split general dissatisfaction and an attempt to place the organization in the hands of the Ohio representatives, making it appear a move for political purposes. The new organization will admit all honorably discharged soldiers, sailors and marines of the Spanish-American war and the Philippines war. Admiral Dewey was selected for commander-in-chief and Governor Roosevelt for senior vice commander. The other officers are: Junior vice commander, Brigadier General Irving Hale, Colorado; adjutant general, William Christopher Liller, Pennsylvania; quartermaster general, Colonel William P. Lane, Maryland; surgeon general, Major Edward C. Davis, Georgia; commissary general, Colonel James B. Corryell, Pennsylvania; inspector general, Colonel George W. Taylor, Virginia; judge advocate general, Colonel James H. Tillman, South Carolina; chief signal officer, Colonel James P. Fyffe, Tennessee; chaplain general, Captain Charles H. Jones, New Jersey; sponsor, Miss Helen M. Gould.

FATAL EXPLOSION OF GAS IN A TRENCH. New York, Nov. 24.—By the explosion of gas in a trench at Broadway and Canal street yesterday Charles O'Neill, in the employ of the Metropolitan Street company, lost his life and six others were injured. The report of the explosion was terrific. Gas had accumulated in the trench, which was covered with four inch planks. A sheet of flame suddenly shot 20 feet high, and in a moment the air was filled with flying planks and broken glass.
