BATTLE WITH VAQUIS.

Indians Put to Flight and Over

Hundred Squaws Captured. Austin, Tex., Dec. 4.-Information reaching here from Ortiz, state of onora, Mex., states that Marshal Ter nune, an expert mine engineer, has been in the mines in the Yaqui country for some months past, has at rived at Ortiz. He announces that the Yaqui Indians and the Mexican military force have had several severe en gagements, attended with loss of and a number of wounded. The first of these engagements was on Nov. I just north of Cocori, and during the engagement there were 48 Indians and five soldiers killed outright. In addition there were 23 soldiers wounded and something over a hundred squawe and indian children captured by the military forces. These prisoners will be sent to Guayamus by the military authorities to be held as hostages. The piace where this engagement took piace is on the Yaqui river, just at the entrance to the mountains. The fighting was very severe and lasted most of the day. The Indians were finally put to flight and this explains why so many of their women were captured. There were several other engagements of minor importance dur ing the week following.

Miners Ousted by Women. Cheyenne, Wyo., Dec. 4.—A week ago 600 miners employed in the mines of the Diamondville Coal and Coke company, at Diamondville, Wyo. struck for an increase in wages. Their demands were refused by the com-pany, and after a short shutdown operations were resumed with a small force of non-union men. Yesterday a mob of 300 women and girls, armed with guns, knives, clubs and stones marched on the mines and compelle the operators to flee. The miners a work were dragged from the mines and also driven away. Several were severely injured. The deputies were powerless. More trouble is expected.
